Packed College Calendar Revealed For New Year

A jam-packed College Calendar for the 1960-61 school year here in Aggieland was released yesterday by the MSC Directorate Office.

Except for Wednesdays, which are held open for church services as much as possible, nearly every other day during the entire school year is marked with planned meetings and special occasions. This also includes the 1961 summer session, which, unlike last year, is also on the calendar.

Also for the first time, both sides of the paper are used, with September through February on one side and March through August on the other side.

Holidays

Of prime importance to most students, most likely, is the slate of three official college holiday periods set for the year. They are Thanksgiving, which runs from Nov. 24-28, Christmas, which is from Dec. 17-Jan. 2, 1961, and the annual Spring Recess, set Mar. 29-Apr. 4.

Of immediate magnitude is also the schedule of 10 Aggie football games, including three at Kyle Field. The Cadets will host Texas

Tech Sept. 24, TCU Oct. 15 and for the 1960-61 school year here in Aggieland was released yesterday by the MSC Directorate Office. The fighting Farmers will play seven games away from home, at LSU Saturday night, Trinity Oct. 1, Houston Oct. 8, Baylor Oct. 22, SMU Nov. 5, Rice Nov. 12 and Texas Nov. 24.

The two official Corps Trips are to the SMU and Texas games. Of the three home games, only one, TCU, is in the afternoon, with the others at night. Of the road games Baylor, Rice and SMU and Texas are day games, with LSU, Trinity and Houston under the lights.

All-college dances are set after two of the three home games, TCU and Arkansas.

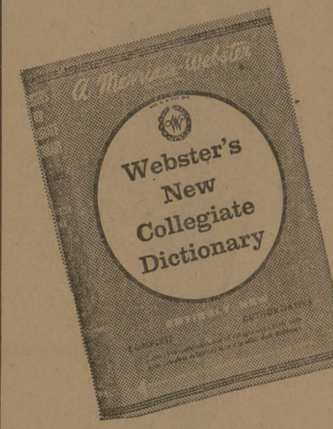
Marked in Red
