## New Assistant Entomologist To Assume Duties Saturday

Weldon H. Newton will become assistant entomologist for the Texas Agricultural Experiment Station. He will also work closely with the entomology staff, and with the county extension agents in their educational programs on insect control.

The new entomologist is a native of Brown County; the son of Mr. and Mrs. Lewis E. Newton of Cross Cut. He is a graduate of Cross Plains High School and A.M. He holds a B.S. degree in entomology and has recently com-

pleted all academic work for an M.S. degree in the same field. He will receive his degree in January.

Newton has worked as a technician and research assistant for the Texas Agricultural Experiment Station for the past two years while doing graduate study. He is the U. S. Army Reserve, Medical Corps, and last year completed six months of active duty.

## Congo Bears Note Written Lumumba

LEOPOLDVILLE, The Congo — The Congo government commissioners made public Wednesday an intimate letter from Ghana's President Kwame Nkrumah advising "my dear Patrice" Lumumba how to manipulate enemies and friends to regain and hold power over the Congo.

They also handed out copies of letters they said Lumumba wrote to the Soviet Union and Red China asking for heavy arms, food, personnel and volunteers.

The commissioners serving under strongman Col. Joseph Mobutu emphasized that the four-page Nkrumah letter on Ghana government stationery reached here seven days after Lumumba was fired as premier by President Joseph Kasavubu. It was dated Sept. 12.

Ghana quickly acknowledged that the letter carrying Nkrumah's advice to Lumumba was genuine. Nkrumah is in New York attending the U.N. General Assembly, campaigning for an all-African handling of the Congo problem and promoting — without success so far — the idea of a big African-Asian neutral bloc on the international scene.

There was no immediate comment from the Ghana delegation in New York after it learned of the publication of the Nkrumah letter in Leopoldville.

The letter advised Lumumba to make use of his enemies as well as of the United Nations to re-establish his power and eliminate them later.

Col. Mobutu, 29, has demanded immediate withdrawal of Ghana troops from the U.N. Congo forces. The Congo strongman has charged that both Ghana and Guinea favored the Communist-backed Lumumba in the Congo's power struggle.

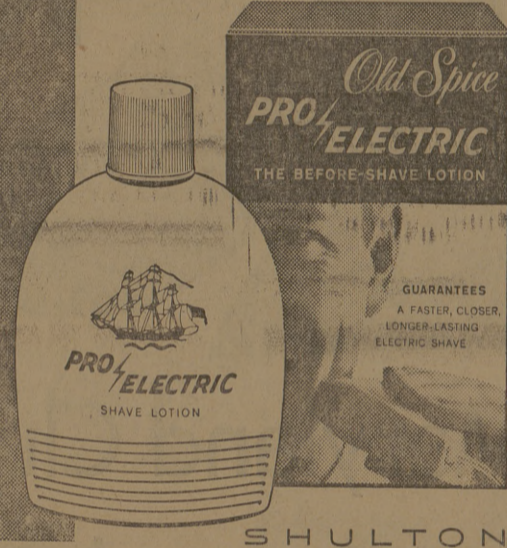
The letter made public Wednesday advised Lumumba that "the policy 'to do away with your enemies now' will fail. You must adopt tactical action."

The letter advised Lumumba to "be as cool as a cucumber and consolidate your position. Work with your bitterest political enemies for the present."

"Brother, mark my advice," the letter said. "We have been in the game for some time now and know how to handle the imperialists and the colonialists. The only colonialist or imperialist that I trust is a dead one."

# Concrete Research Center To Open Here October 6

The National Bituminous Concrete Assn., a non-profit organization of some 600 bituminous concrete producers, will formally open its new research headquarters here Oct. 6.

The ceremonies, which will start at 2 p.m. in the Memorial Student Center Assembly Room, will feature talks by President Earl Ruder; R. B. Butler, president of the Bryan Industrial Foundation, Inc.; Fred Benson, Dean of Engineering and director of the Texas Transportation Institute, and Bryant M. Collins of Austin, president of National Bituminous Concrete Assn.

Charles Foster, co-ordinator of research for the association and head of the new offices here, said the public is invited to the opening. He said the ceremonies also

will include a tour of Texas Transportation Institute facilities and the research headquarters.

Announced in July

The National Bituminous Concrete Assn. announced in July the decision to locate its research headquarters on the A&M campus. Working to encourage the organization's location at the school were A&M, the Cities of Bryan and College Station, the Bryan Industrial Foundation, Inc. and the Bryan-College Station Chamber of Commerce.

Primary objectives of the association are to improve the specifications and materials used in the construction procedures for bituminous concrete (asphalt pavement).

Has Adopted Research Program

tion has adopted a research program which contemplates expanding expenditures for research in various fields having to do with bituminous concrete.

Initially, it is planned that the research will be carried on through support of university programs, co-operative projects with State Highway Departments of federal agencies and contracts with research institutes. In addition, some funds will be available for scholarships for graduate students interested in bituminous concrete.

"The advantage to A&M of the location of the association's research activity here lies in the fact that the association program will augment and support our existing research and teaching program in this area," Benson said.
