Rogers, Hargett Take Over Rushing Lead for A & M Fish

After three games, two of which are victories, Jerry Rogers of Corpus Christi has taken over the rushing department for the Fish with 152 yards on 42 carries for a 3.6 average. George Hargett of Linden is close behind Rogers with 143 yards on 13 carries for a 11.0 average.

Passing—Linnstaedter
Jim Linnstaedter of Brenham has dominated the passing department with 12 attempts, 4 completions, 2 interceptions for a total of 80 yards. Eddie Hall of Dickinson has two completions on four attempts for 20 yards.

In the receiving department, Phil Peter of Houston leads with two grabs for 62 yards. Hargett has made two catches for 19 yards.

Hargett is the kingpin of the scoring department with 14 points which include one touchdown, five extra points and one field goal. Rogers, Linnstaedter, Hall and Peter are all tied for second place with one TD.

In the punting department Hall is the dominator with 19 kicks for 663 yards and an average of 35.2 yards per kick.

Hargett is still the leader in punt returns despite a shoulder injury with six returns for 112 yards and an 18.7 per return average. Travis Reagan of Wichita Falls is second with four returns for 65 yards and an average of 16.2.

Reagan is the leader in the kick-off return department with three returns for 59 yards and a 19.7 average. Hargett is next with two returns for 30 yards and an average of 15.0.

Fish Idle
This week the Fish are idle, but get into action next Thursday night in Houston against the Rice Owlets. The Fish have a record of 2-1 which includes victories over the Baylor Cubs and the University of Houston Kittens, and a season opener loss to the TCU Wogs. The Rice Owlets are still looking for their first win this season after three starts.

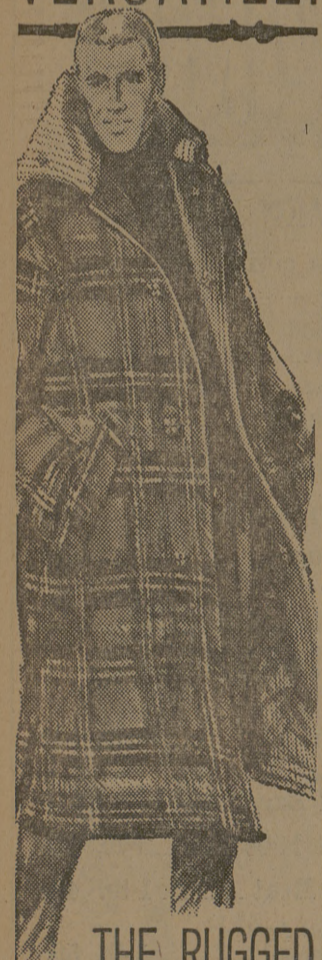

AN ORDINANCE REZONING CERTAIN AREAS WITHIN THE CITY LIMITS, FIXING TIME OF PUBLICATION AND PUBLIC HEARING.
BE IT ORDAINED by the City Council of College Station, Texas:
Section 1. Upon recommendation of the City Zoning Commission, the following described area is hereby changed from district No. 3 (Apartment House District) to District No. 4 (Business District) as defined in Ordinance No. 88.
Being part of a one acre tract conveyed to Norton R. Burkhalter by I. P. Cooner, May 9, 1935, Volume 89, Page 45.
Beginning at a point where the North line of said one acre tract intersects the East line of Highway No. 6;
Thence, North 45 East along the North line of said one acre tract 150 feet and corner;
Thence, South 45 East 70 feet and corner;
Thence, South 45 West with the alley or street line now established 150 feet and corner on the West line of said one acre tract, and the East line of Highway No. 6;
Thence, with said line 70 feet to the place of beginning, fronting 70 feet on Highway No. 6, and running back 150 feet.
Section 2. That a public hearing shall be held in the City Hall at 7:00 p. m. November 28, 1960.
Section 3. That a notice of said hearing shall be published in the official city newspaper at least fifteen (15) days prior to the date of said public hearing.
