The bonfire first-aid team did another fine job of providing firstaid treatment to Aggies hurt during bonfire operations.

Robert J. Brown, head of the team, said that each of his men were thoroughly versed in first-aid procedures and techniques.

The team gave aid to over 150 slightly injured students. The first-aid team established three aid stations. One of these
