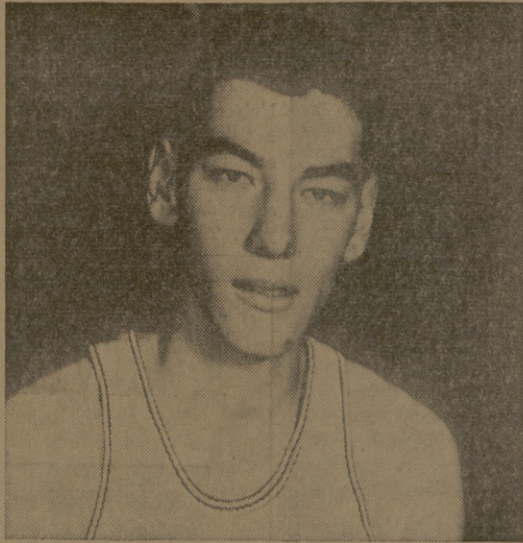




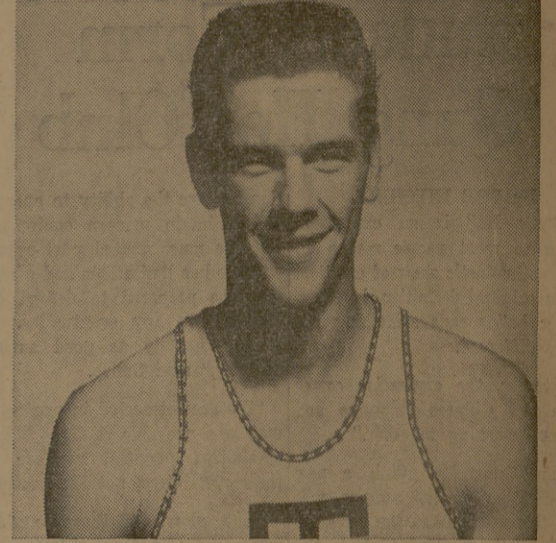

Lid Comes Off 1960-61 Cage Season in San Antonio Tonight

The lid will be lifted on the 1960-61 basketball season tonight in San Antonio as A&M meets Trinity University.

There will be many familiar faces in the Aggie troop this year,

since only four seniors were lost. Six lettermen will bid for top positions on almost the same team that compiled a 19-5 record last season. Last years won-loss record was one of the best ever turned in

by an Aggie team. **One Soph Starter** Four of the returning lettermen are slated for starting duties against Trinity tonight. Carroll Broussard, Pat Stanley, Wayne Annett and Don Stanley will make up the veteran starters while Jerry Windham, a 6-6 soph will fill in at the post position.

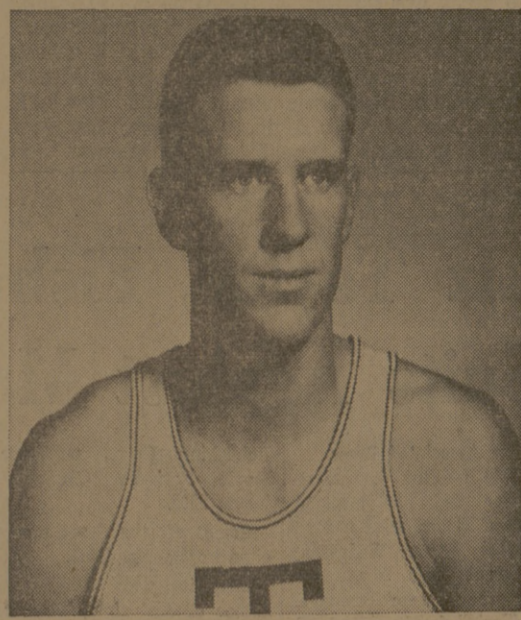
A up-and-coming JC transfer, Ronnie Durbon, is tabbed a strong contender for the starting lineup as well as big Lewis Qualls.

Plenty of Depth The Cadet's have a lot of depth on this year's squad with lettermen Tommy Smith and Elliott Craig. Smith is only a junior in eligibility and still is a little shy on experience while Craig has earned two letters as a quick, sure-shot guard.

Besides Windham and Qualls, last year's Fish team sent up some top prospects for the varsity in Charlie Minor, Billy Young, Jim Keller and Lee Walker. Both Young and Keller are very fast and Walker is the second tallest man the coaches as well as many other interested people, when Broussard turned his ankle. However, he recovered quickly and will be on hand at full speed tonight.

Minor Recovering Minor was the top Fish playmaker last season, but was hampered with a knee injury in the middle of the season. He reinjured his knee in early season practice and is now on the road to full recovery while Craig has earned two letters as a quick, sure-shot guard.

Last week another injury upset the squad, standing 6-7.

San Antonio School Pulled From State Football Playoffs

The executive committee of the University Interscholastic League pulled San Antonio Sam Houston out of the schoolboy football playoffs Wednesday and barred the team from championship competition next year.

San Antonio school will be allowed to play football next year, but the games will not count toward a district title. Other Sam Houston teams will not be affected by the ruling.

The suspension is one of the stiffest ever handed a schoolboy football team, Dr. Rhea Williams, head of the Interscholastic League, said after the committee's ruling in Austin.

The league acted on reports that a player hit an official during a melee after the Uvalde-Sam Houston game. Players and fans from both schools reportedly took part.

This followed an investigation of an incident in which a Sam Houston player reportedly struck an official during a game at Uvalde Oct. 28.

Seguin of Dist. 13 AAA replaces Sam Houston, 14-AAA co-champion, as a Class AAA quarter-

finalist. Sam Houston defeated Seguin 26-7 last week in bi-district play.
