

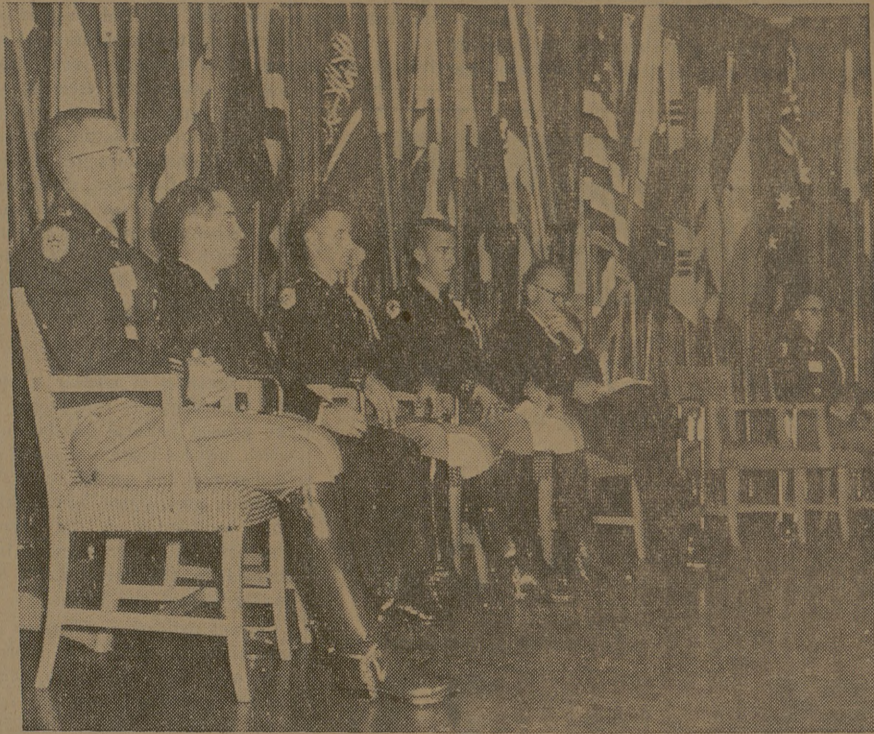

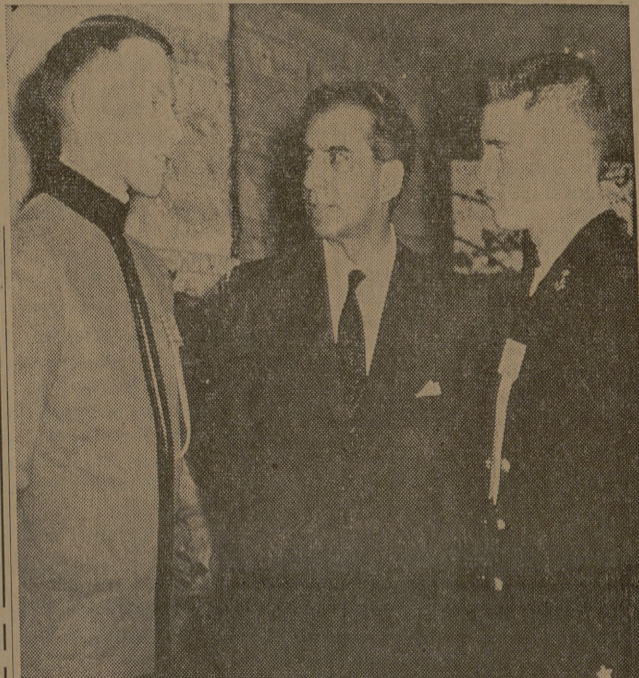

... (left to right) Rudder, Sharp, Harrington



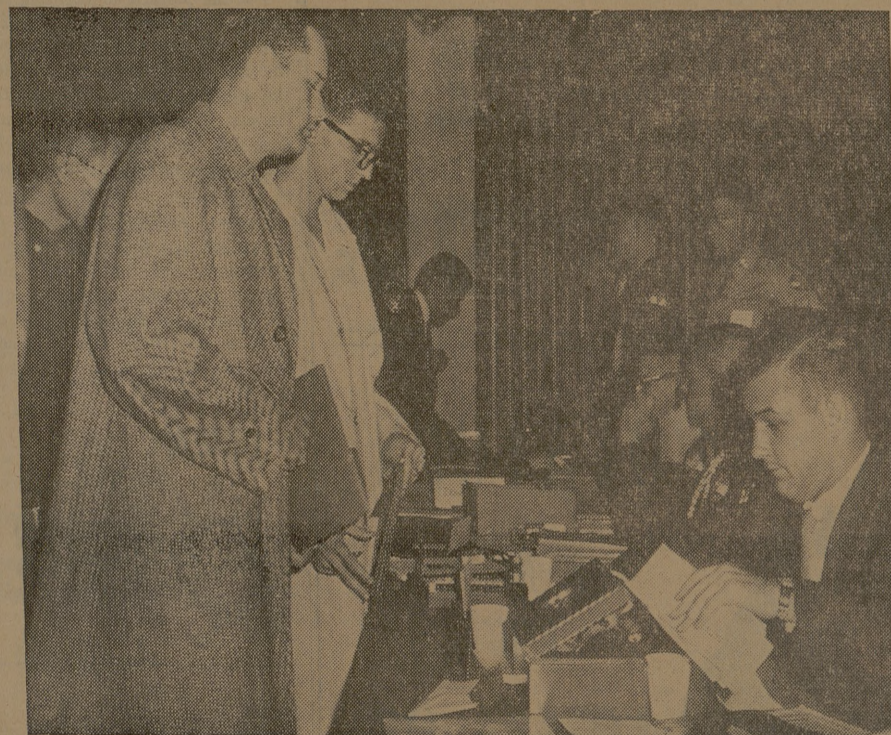

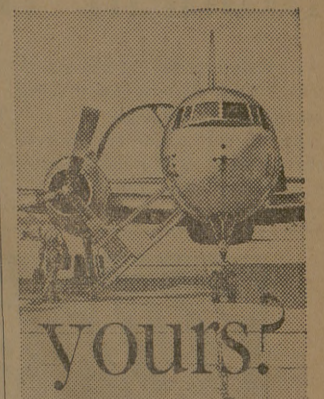
