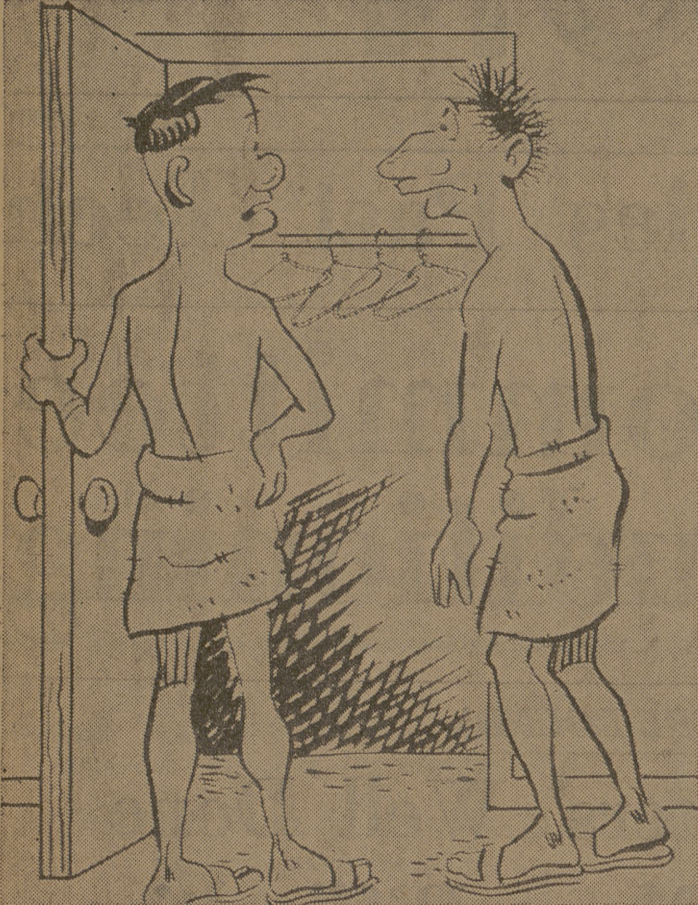

The Freeport Sulphur Co. will talk to seniors majoring in chemical engineering or organic chemistry for employment in the research and development field of sulphur.

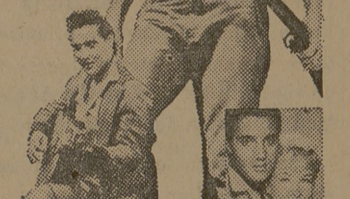
