JFK Warns Soviets Against 'Unilateral' Congo Mingling

By The Associated Press WASHINGTON — President Kennedy warned Russia Wednesday night against any attempt to "intervene unilaterally" in the Congo.

United Nations members to oppose any such intervention. The President, opening his news conference with a statement on the Congo crisis, did not specifically name Russia but said he was "seriously concerned at what appears to be a threat of unilateral intervention."

This was an obvious reference to Russia's recognition of the rebel government of Antoine Gizenga at Stanleyville—recognition coupled with a promise of support and aid.

The "only legitimate authority" qualified to speak for the entire Congo, Kennedy said, is the government of President Kasavubu at Leopoldville. He said discussions are under way with other countries about broadening this government politically.

Kennedy also deplored any attempt to "destroy" the United Nations—again an evident reference to Russia's demand Tuesday for withdrawal of United Nations forces from the Congo and for ouster of Dag Hammarskjold as U.N. secretary-general.

The United States has supported and will continue to support the United Nations, Kennedy declared. He made clear that support extends fully to the United Nations operation in the Congo.

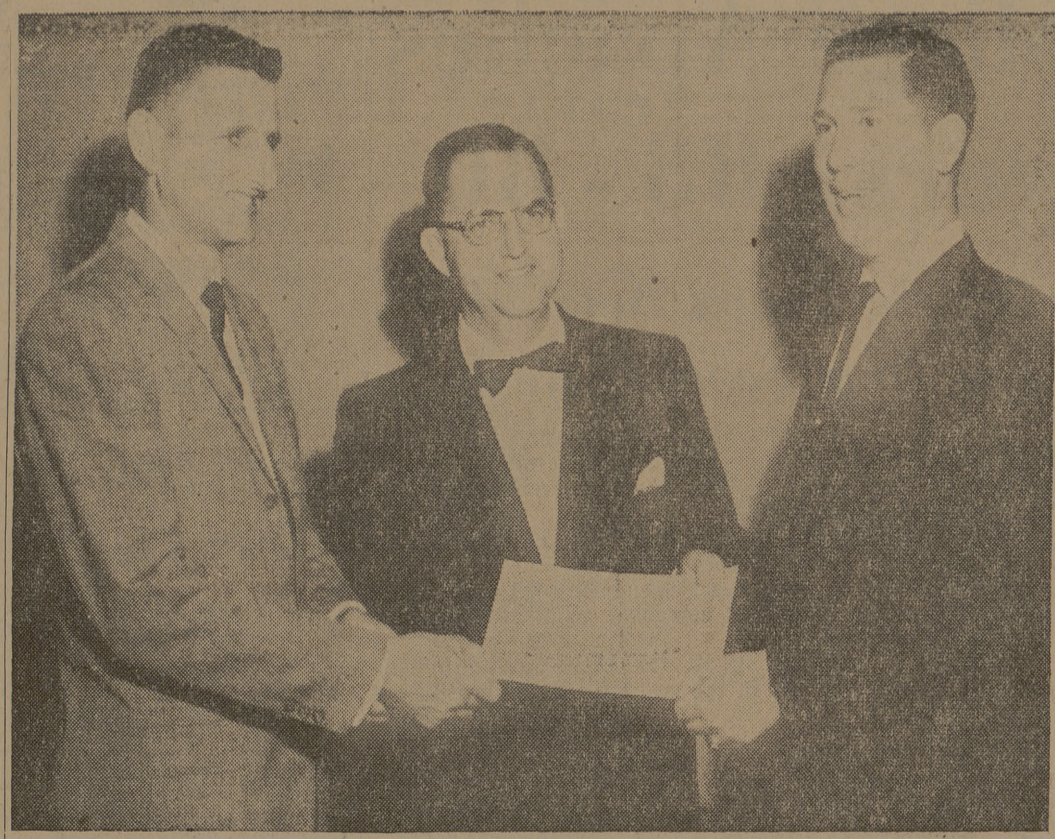
The United States and other member U. N. government, he added, have the duty to oppose any attempt by any government to intervene unilaterally in the strife-torn Congo.
