A. S. C. E. Captures Career Day Prize

The Student Engineer's Council announced yesterday that the Department of Civil Engineering copped first place in the engineer's annual Career Day exhibit contest. The A&M chapter of the American Society of Civil Engineers prepared and manned the display. Dean of Engineering Fred J.

Benson will present a rotating trophy to the department at an engineering faculty convocation later in the semester.

The exhibits were judged on appearance, organization, amount of originality and initiative, how well displayed and how well manned by students.

Judges also mentioned exhibits in the Department of Electrical Engineering, Department of Agricultural Engineering, Department of Geology and Department of Industrial Engineering. Technical Societies in the individual departments are usually responsible for the exhibits.
