

Bowling Tourney Held Here On MSC Lanes

 The Texas A&M Match Bowling Team hosts the Texas Intercollegiate Bowling Conference on the Memorial Student Center Lanes this Saturday at 9, 1 and 3 p.m. The Aggies will be seeking their second straight conference championship.

Winners last year in a going-away manner, the Cadets are on the verge of breaking this year's action wide open. They will enter Saturday's meet a 12½ game leader over second place Southern Methodist University.

Earlier this month in San Antonio the team all but mathematically sewed up this year's race. Saturday they can win it outright in their 1 p.m. match with SMU. The Cadet keglers can eliminate the Ponies and cop the crown by winning four.

The Match Team will be composed of three veterans and two new-comers. The vets are Larry Dantzer, junior civil engineering major from Dallas, Frank Pearce, sophomore economics major from Corpus Christi, and Lee Wilson, senior education major from Austin. The new-comers, although not new to conference action, are Bob Korose, freshman chemistry major from Houston, and Bob Norris, sophomore pre-law major from Lubbock.

Posted Fine Average
 The Aggie team represents a fine 893 average, which is a good deal more than 178 per man. Dantzer leads the team with a 192 average; he is followed by Wilson, with 180, Korose, 177, Pearce, 173, and Norris, 171. Parks Mahaney, a regular mem-

ber of the match team with a 187 average, will not be bowling in College Station. He will be in Detroit, Mich., representing A&M in the National Intercollegiate Bowling Rolloffs.

The Conference will be bowling all day Saturday and everybody is invited to come out and watch some fine bowling. Admission is free.

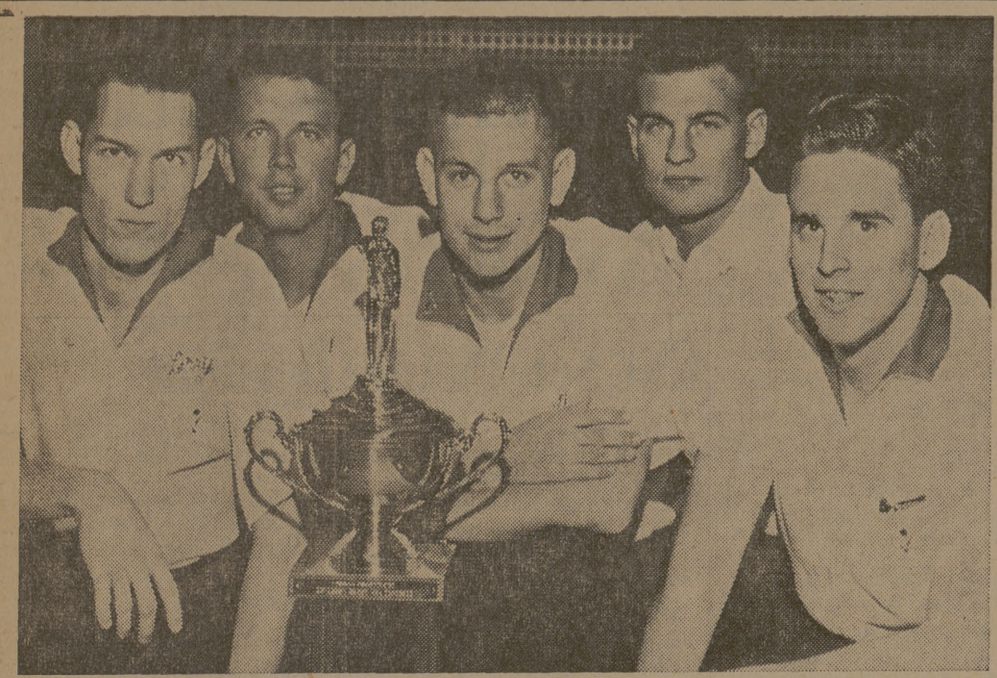
Cadets Tabbed Favorites In Lamar Tech's Meet

Aggies Shot Down By Gophers, 10-5

After taking the first game of a two game series, the Aggie baseballers went down at the hands of last year's NCAA champs, the Minnesota Gophers, 10-5.

The Cadets jumped off to a quick lead in the first inning on the help of the Gopher center-fielder's error. Catcher Bill Puckett drove in Byron Barber from second base and the Aggies led for the only time during the afternoon, 1-0.

In the Gopher half of the second inning, they batted around and scored five runs, four of them on pitcher Howard Nathe's grand slam homer.

After the second inning, the Aggies were never really in the game.

Don Costlow, who was the los-

ing pitcher, started on the mound for the Cadets and finally gave way to Barber in the third frame. Barber came in from left field to pitch his first game this season. He pitched 3½ innings, then went back to left field as Mike Spence came in to chuck the final three frames.

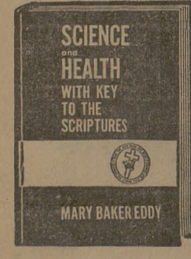
The big star for Minnesota was Nathe, who drove in five runs and was the winning pitcher. All-American first baseman Wayne Knapp collected three hits for the Gophers, including a home run.

Big gun for the Ags was short-stop Jack Singley who hit a homer and drove in two runs. Singley also made several outstanding plays from his position. Barber added another Aggie run in the 7th inning as he smashed his second homer of the baseball campaign.

Dick Hickerson, the big red-headed first sacker, continued his hitting streak as he now has hit safely in eight straight Aggie games.

The Aggies go to Dallas Saturday where they meet the SMU Mustangs in a SWC game.
