ONE OF SIX IN STATE

Reyna Awarded Research Fellowship

Eddie Reyna, a research assistant in the A & M Department of Physics is one of six graduate students from Texas colleges and universities who have been awarded summer research fellowships in atomic energy by the Texas Atomic Energy Research Foundation and the General Atomic Division of General Dynamics Corporation. This announcement was made today by C. L. Young, president of the Foundation, which consists of 11 Texas power companies.
 Recipients of the research fellowships are: Miss Margaret Ann Brennan of Terrell, Dwight L. Cole of Raymondville, Edward J. Dowdy of San Antonio, Worth B. Hart, Jr. of Houston, Mark D. Engel of Denton and Reyna, of Huntsville.
 The summer fellowship program was inaugurated in 1960 by the Foundation and General Atomic, who have, for the past five years jointly sponsored the world's first

and largest privately financed program of controlled thermonuclear research.
 The research is directed toward finding a way of controlling and sustaining a fusion reaction. If nuclear fusion—the energy process of the sun and star—can be brought under control for the production of electrical power, the world will have an almost limitless source of fuel to meet its future energy requirements. This is because the fuel for fusion, deuterium, is present in abundance in the oceans of the world.
 The recipients of the six fellowships were selected by a committee composed of representatives of Texas educational institutions, General Atomic and the Foundation. They will assist in theoretical and experimental research at the General Atomic laboratory in San Diego, Calif., this summer. All of the recipients intend to pursue their studies toward advanced

degrees in atomic science or mathematics.
 Miss Brennan, who is a senior mathematics major at the University of Dallas, will begin work on her Master's degree after graduation this June. Cole expects to receive his Master's degree in electrical engineering from the University of Texas in June. Dowdy is a physics and mathematics student at St. Mary's University in San Antonio where he is preparing for a career in nuclear physics.
 Hurt is a candidate for a Master's degree in physics at the University of Texas and is presently a research assistant in the University's physics department. Kregel expects to receive his Master of Science degree in June from North Texas State College in Denton where he is currently doing research in plasma dynamics. Reyna, who is a research assistant in the Department of Physics ob-

tained his Master of Science degree in 1959.
 In announcing the awarding of the fellowships, Young declared: "One of the purposes of the Texas Atomic Energy Research Foundation is to aid and foster scientific knowledge in Texas. We feel that these fellowships, which proved so successful last year, will serve this purpose by bringing into the state some of the knowledge and experience being developed by the scientists at General Atomic."
 Young is president of the West Texas Utilities Company of Abilene, one of the 11 companies comprising the Foundation. The other member companies are: Central Power & Light Co., Community Public Service Co., Dallas Power & Light Co., El Paso Electric Co., Gulf States Utilities Co., Houston Lighting & Power Co., Southwestern Electric Power Co., Southwestern Public Service Co., Texas Electric Service Co., and Texas Power & Light Co.
