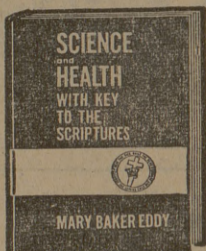

## New 'Moon Shot' Experiment Proving Successful for Wally

By Associated Press Any day now they'll be calling sliced home runs over the left field screen in the Los Angeles Coliseum "moon-shots." That's because the Dodgers' southpaw swinging Wally Moon appears to have perfected the art of dumping fly balls for homers in that sector.

Moon has hit six home runs in eight games, all over the Coliseum's 42-foot-high left field screen, only 251 feet from home plate. The Dodger outfielder, an

honor student at Texas A&M some years ago, claims a newly perfected "reverse english" swing has been largely responsible for his sudden rash of homers.

In any event, Wally struck two of those "moon-shots" Wednesday night to lead the Dodgers to a 7-2 triumph over the St. Louis Cardinals. The first homer came with two on in the first inning. The second was a solo flight in the fourth. He walked in the sixth and slashed a run-scoring single—to center—in the seventh to account for five runs batted in with a perfect evening at the plate.

Cincinnati made it two straight over San Francisco with a 4-2 triumph and retained first place in the National League. Pittsburgh climbed into second place with a 4-1 victory over Chicago. Rain stopped Milwaukee and Philadelphia for the second straight day.

A&M's season record now stands at 10-5-1 and the conference record is 2-3-1. Rice has proven to be the downfall of the Cadets in the loss column since all the conference games that have been lost were to the Owls.

The biggest factor in all of the Aggie wins this season has been their ability at the plate, but in the last few games the hitting has been fading. Before the double header with Rice last weekend the team was hitting .269, but this week the average has fallen to .256.

The hitting "slump" has shown up in the top of the batting order as the top four men's average dropped.

Mike Spence is still the top man at the plate for the Aggies with an average of .400. Since he is a pitcher, Spence has only played in eight games, but his average before the Rice game was .571.

Clifford (Stuffie) Davis moved into the number one position of the regulars this week with a .375 average. However, his previous average was .382.

Dick Hickerson, who has been the leading hitter for many weeks, dropped his average from .389 to .361 for a third place.

Byron Barber's average went from a .328 to a .304. Barber is still the leading round-trip hitter for the Aggies with five.

The only man to join the ".300 ranks" after the last games was Ray Hall who sports a .319 average.

Next weekend the Aggies will return to Kyle Field as they meet Southern Methodist University at 3 Friday afternoon and at 2:30 Saturday.
