



> Soviet Foreign Minister Andrei A. Gromyko submitted his proposal to the international conference on Laos shortly after Secretary of State Dean Rusk introduced an American plan.

Both plans envisioned a neutral policy for Laos and evacuation of all foreign troops to end the isolated nation's role as a pawn in the East-West cold war. But Abram Chayes, U.S. State Department legal adviser, said Gromyko has introduced "a double-barreled type of vote."

Rusk promised that all Amerian troops would pull out of Laos f foreign Communist forces advising the pro-Communist Pathet Lao rebels also would leave.

U.S. troops now consist of a small training mission of about 300 men.

The size of foreign Communist forces is not known but may be several thousand men.

Cuba Wants To Make Deal--**Prisoners For Bulldozers**

Minister Fidel Castro has offered thusiasm for production and work." to trade more than 1,000 prisoners of the April 17 invasion for 500 American bulldozers.

The startling swords-for-plowshares offer Wednesday night evoked wild cheers from several thousand peasants assembled at the rancho boyeros agricultural fair near Havana.

If the prisoners are not ransomed, Castro said, "they will work hard, building trenches and fortifications, so that they will have to earn the bread they eat." Referring to President Kennedy


