The "get together" was started at 6:30 Tuesday when the visitors assembled by districts for short orientation sessions.

Tuesday afternoon a chuckwagon barbecue officially opened the activities. Director John E. Hutchison of the Agricultural Extension Service welcomed the group and introduced members of the Recognition Committee, members of the Board of Directors and officials of the A&M College System.

Eleven individual awards were presented by President Earl Ruder at the general assembly fol-
