

Tarleton State Records Large '61 Enrollment

Tarleton State College, part of the A&M College System, recorded the second largest enrollment in its history when 1,859 students registered last week for the fall semester. The all-time high was in 1946 when veteran enrollment numbered 1,435.

President E. J. Howell said, "We are pleased with the enrollment, not only with the size of the junior class and the large increase in women students but with the large freshmen class which will carry over during the next four years."

A breakdown provided by the registrar showed a total of 965 males and 424 women. Enrollment figures compared to last year's 1,144 show an increase of 21.4 per cent.

Tarleton is in its first year as a senior college. The first junior class, with 107 students, was enrolled this year. Senior courses will be taught in the fall of 1962.

ORDINANCE NO 328
An ordinance creating a municipal Defense and Disaster Committee and providing the powers of that committee; creating the office of municipal defense coordinator and providing the duties and responsibilities of that office; creating an operational organization; granting necessary powers to cope with emergencies threatening life and property in the city of College Station; authorizing cooperative and mutual aid agreements for relief work between this and other cities or counties; and for related purposes; prohibiting unauthorized acts and warning and all-clear signals; and making violations a misdemeanor punishable by fine not exceeding \$100.00.
