lowest possible cost to the student. It was to be a practical education, one which would provide the student with the knowledge and skills necessary for suc-

cess in future life," the new president said.

An 1878-79 A&M school catalog gives an idea of the courses offered in those early days compared to the extensive offerings of today. The 248 students of that period had a choice of four "courses"—agriculture, mechanics and engineering, languages and literature and military tactics.

Departments included the Commercial Department (bookkeeping and the "Philosophy and Morals of Business"), Department of Ancient Languages, Department of Natural and Experimental Philosophy and Engineering, Department of Mathematics, Department of Mental and Moral Philosophy and Department of English Language and Literature.
