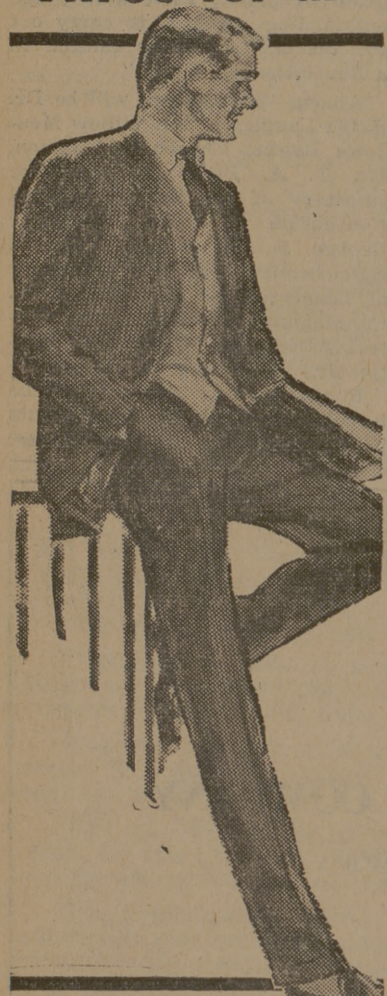

Gibbs, Cook Leading SWC In Total Offense, Rushing

Texas Christian's Sonny Gibbs and Texas' Jerry Cook maintained leadership for total offense and ball-carrying honors respectively in the Southwest Conference through two games, but Doug Cannon, a young sophomore from Texas Tech, has moved ahead of a talented group of veteran throwers to emerge as the leading passer. Cannon salvaged some consolation for himself and the Red Raiders by completing 13 of 24 attempts for 114 yards as Tech fell to Texas. This gave him 15 completions in 27 attempts for the season and a gain of 134 yards. Billy Cox of Rice, the leader last week, dropped to sixth place, while Gibbs moved up to second by completing 7 of 12 in the 7-7 tie with Ohio State.

topflight performance, Texas' stable of swift backs have hogged four of the top six places among the ball-carrying leaders, with Poage, who gained 104 against Tech, and Sophomore Tommy Ford joining in the select circle.

Ags, Raiders Both Winless

After two games and not a win in the standings, the Aggies hit the road again this week in search for their first victory. The Texas Tech Red Raiders will be the Cadets' opponent and they, too, have yet to win one. Last week in Austin the Texas Longhorns trampled the Red Raiders with a 42-14 victory. The score could have been worse! Matt Lair, former A&M defensive line coach and now coach at Tech, had only one comment, "They kind of embarrassed us, didn't they?" Good news hit the Aggie camp yesterday as they went through a rugged workout—second team left tackle, Ben Krenek, has returned from the injured list and will be ready for Tech.

Two other soph — Tommy Crutcher of TCU and Tom Sherwin of SMU—continue to rank high among the leading ball carriers. The 6-7 Gibbs, described as an "Eye-full" tower after a brilliant all-round performance against Ohio State, is the total offense leader with an aggregate of 271 yards, 229 passing and 42 rushing. Cook held on to second place with his rushing total of 194, while Saxton ranks next with a fantastic per-play average of 11 yards.

Mike Cotten of Texas, who has the best completion percentage of the leaders, and Baylor's combo of Ronnie Stanley and Bobby Ply rank, in that order, behind Cannon and Gibbs in pass completions. Cotten hit 7 of 8 against Texas Tech to claim a .888 mark (11 of 16) for the season, while Stanley threw two come-from-behind touchdown passes in the second half of Baylor's conquest of Pitt.

Injury Riddled Freshmen Meet Wogs Here Thursday

The Aggies will preview their future varsity players when the freshman team clashes with TCU at Kyle Field here Thursday night.

The 7:30 p.m. kickoff will mark the debut of Ty Bain as the A&M Freshman football coach.

Bain came to Aggieland last January following nine years of service to Kilgore High School as athletic director and head football coach.

Three high school all-state honorees will be in the Aggie Fish starting lineup.

They include Tackle Ronny Moore of Brownwood, Guard Melvin Simmons of Odessa and Halfback Tommy Meeks of Bryan.

Two other all-staters are on the injured list, including Halfback Budgie Ford of Taylor (he also won high school all-American honors) and Guard Ray Gene Hinze of Waco LaVega.

Also sidelined with injuries are Tackles Ray Chancellor of Waco LaVega and Maynard Rogers of Port Lavaca.

Ford has a shoulder separation which is expected to keep him out of action for about three weeks and Hinze and Chancellor have leg injuries.
