Sauer will compete in the national FFA Livestock Judging Contest at the FFA Convention in Kansas City. Lehmann is the Texas representative to the Central and Western U. S. 4-H Tractor Operators Contest Oct. 15-17 in Dallas.

Capital recording star Ray Anthony and his Bookends will open this year's Town Hall Season Friday, Oct. 27, according to Gary Anderson, Town Hall chairman.

Anthony, accompanied by a seven-piece orchestra and two beautiful vocalists, will present two 45-minute shows with music and dialogue. The group has been appearing regu-

larly at the Hotel Sierra in Las Vegas for the past three years.

In November, Town Hall will feature Victor Alessandri's world famous San Antonio Symphony. Alessandri will bring his orchestra to G. Rollie White Coliseum Nov. 13 for a public school concert and remain for the evening presentation.

"Ferrante and Teicher Flip Their Lids" will be Town Hall's Feb. 15 presentation. These young men are noted for their dual piano performances and their interpretations of "The Theme from Exodus" and "Theme from The Apartment."
