

# Linnstaedter Top Ag Rusher; Erickson Leads In Passing

Jim Linnstaedter, sophomore left halfback, jumped from tenth to seventh place in Southwest Conference rushing with a fine day against TCU Saturday. The shifty 170 pounder carried nine times for 65 yards, boosting his total for the season to 219 yards on 39 carries. Linnstaedter boasts a 5.1 average and has yet to lose a yard this season.

Junior Quarterback John Erickson is holding down seventh place among SWC passers, with 17 completions in 32 attempts for one touchdown. Erickson has a fine .531 passing percentage, but his 6.8 yards per pass places him last in that category.

Second leading rusher for the Aggies is Fullback Lee Roy Caffey, who has picked up 150 yards on 29 carries. Caffey has a 5.2 yards per carry average.

Ronnie Brice, junior from Andrews, has the second best passing record. He has connected on six of ten through the air for 83 yards and one touchdown.

Halfback Bob Caskey lost the top receiver spot to Soph Travis Reagan, who has snagged five for 63 yards and one touchdown. Caskey is close behind with five receptions for 60 yards and one TD. Linnstaedter has the best average per reception with four for 76 yards and a 19 yard mark.

The Aggies lead the conference in pass defense and number of interceptions. Ten enemy passes have been stolen and returned for a total of 90 yards. Center Jerry Hopkins has swiped two for 13 yards and Linnstaedter also has stolen two. Brice has the longest return, a 62 yarder against Trinity.

Babe Craig, the Knoxville Bomber, continues to furnish the Cadets with a solid kicking game. Craig has maintained a 38 yard average through 25 punts, even with one being blocked in the LSU game.

Soph George Hargett continues to lead in kickoff returns with four for 36 yards and a nine-yard

average. Linnstaedter has returned five for 30 yards and a six-yard average. Hargett also is the top Cadet punter with two for 31 yards. Linnstaedter is also second to Hargett in this department, turning three for 42 yards.

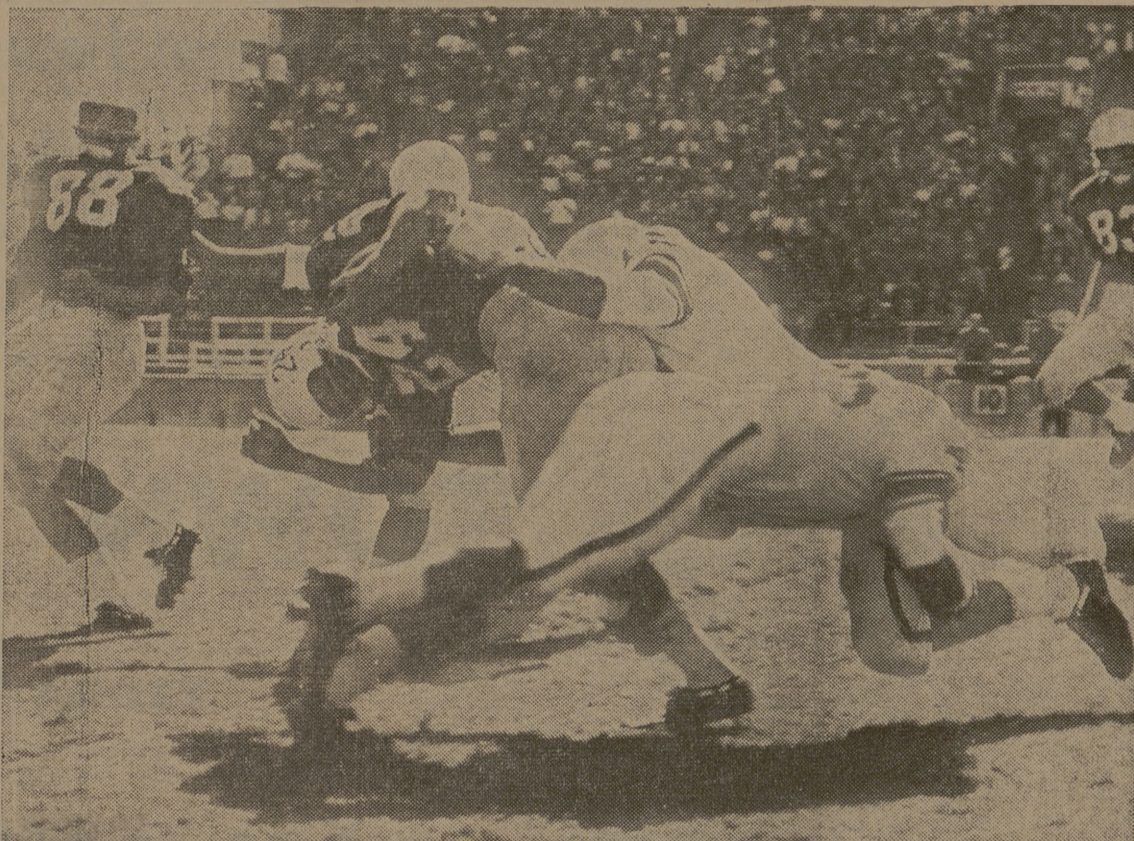

## INTRAMURALS

Yesterday's intramural football results show an exciting 24-12 victory for A-3 over C-2 and four shutouts.

With the passing of Kenneth Ward, the A-3 freshmen were able to score three times and convert while C-2 crossed the goal line twice, each time missing the extra points. The game was highlighted by a 65-yard pass from Ward to Ernest West for a TD. Ward also threw a 20-yard pass to West and a 30-yard aerial to Joseph Campbell for touchdowns.

Other Class B football games were: B-2 over Sqd. 14, 6-0; B-3 over G-3, 8-0; E-1 over Sqd. 15, 16-0; C-1 over Sqd. 11, 21-0. In class A horseshoes F-3 defeated Sqd. 14, Sqd. 8 beat C-2, Sqd. 13 over Sqd. 4 and B-2 defeated B-3.

Monday's basketball was highlighted by two one-point decisions. The real thriller came as undefeated Sqd. 2 fell to determined White Band in a 25-24 contest. High point men were Larry Christian of the White Band with 16 and Pat More of Sqd. 2 with 10. Meanwhile G-1 was barely squeaking by Sqd. 3, 18-17.

In other Class A basketball competition it was Sqd. 6 over C-2, 13-8; B-2 over Sqd. 13, 52-19; and Sqd. 10 had little trouble with the Maroon Band in a 33-17 contest. D-2 defeated B-1, 26-10 and in Class C another high-scoring game saw Puryear Hall beat the Vet Students 49-40.

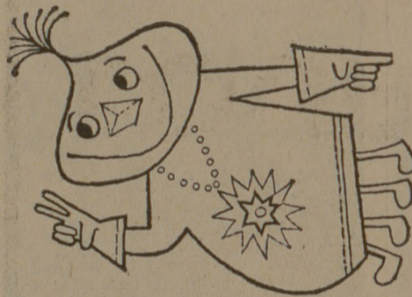
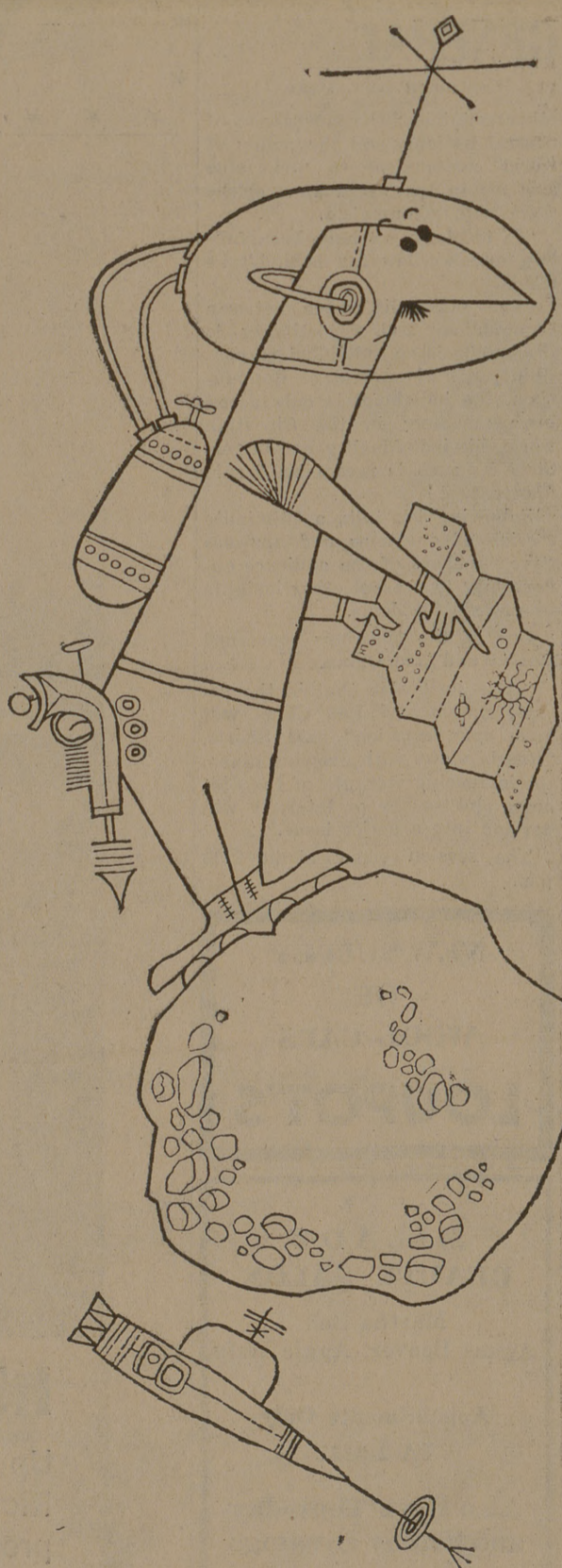
