Celebrity Series Sets Music Study

Dr. Richard Baldauf's Sunday presentation of the "Sunday Celebrity Series" in the Memorial Student Center Ballroom will stress the evolution of swing music, according to Robert L. Boone, series director.

Baldauf is director of the Aggeland Combo and pianist for the Aggeland Dance Band. Accompanying him on the drums will be Tom Prisk, senior math major and drummer for the Aggeland Dance Band.

Baldauf, Department of Wildlife Management, said he would demonstrate the basic fundamentals of music and the changes in chord structure necessary to make them become what we know as modern swing music.

He will use the first half of the program to show how swing came

to be, how it brought changes of style to the musical world, the bearing these changes had on today's music and the effects on the time that it was in vogue.

In the second half, Baldauf will utilize a piano and drum accompaniment to play such favorites as "Tenderly," "Misty," "My Funny Valentine," "S Wonderful," "Honeysuckle Rose" and others to illustrate his points.

Baldauf, who has been interested in the Swing Era for "longer than he cares to remember," has become an expert on this era. Also, he has become quite adept at giving programs describing the era.

Showtime Sunday is at 2:30 p.m. in the MSC Ballroom. Coffee, tea and soft drinks will be served. There is no admission.

Each officially recognized student organization has been assigned a filing cabinet for filing of fiscal records and to serve as a mailing address.
