#### **United Chest Ends Short Of The Goal**

The College Station United Chest Drive officially closed yesterday \$4,491 short of their \$16,200 goal, according to K. A. Manning, campaign chairman for the drive.

As of last night, \$11,708.98 had been collected for the 1961 drive. Manning said a major reason for the drive not reaching its goal was the pay days of some people, especially governmental employees. They were not paid during the duration of the campaign.

"We have not been satisfied with the goal this year, and we won't be until the goal is reached," Manning said.

Even with the extended deadline this year, it will take the concentrated effort of everyone to reach the goal, he added. The new goal date has been set for Nov. 22.
