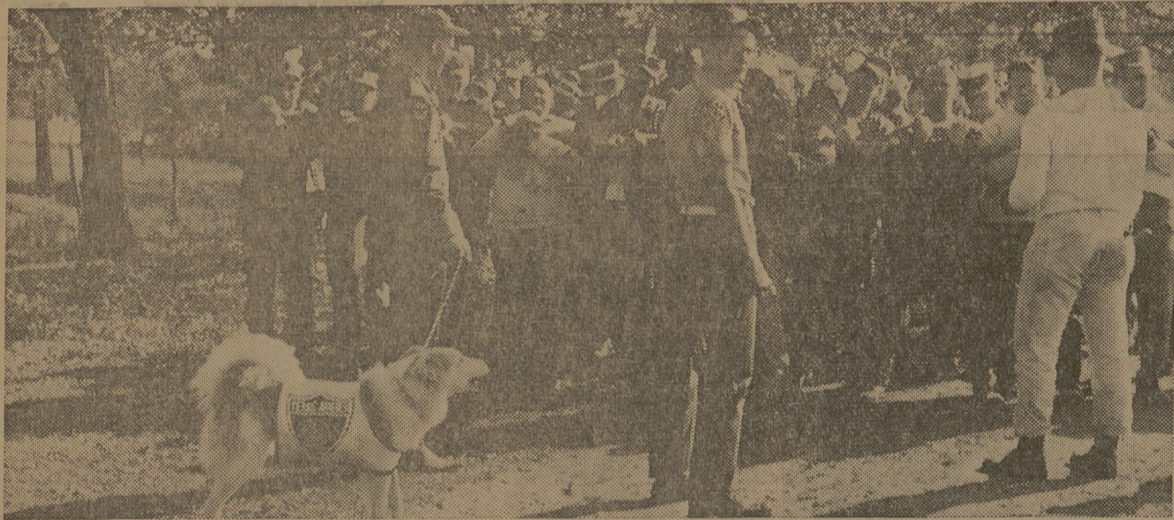


# Coffee And Rest Are Welcome

## 5,200 EXPECTED Thanksgiving Meal Scheduled Tonight

A&M's annual and much-anticipated Thanksgiving dinner in the college dining halls is scheduled tonight for students and guests.

The menu for the fete reads:

Roast turkey, corn bread dressing, giblet gravy, candied yams, lima beans, quartered lettuce, 1,000-island dressing, relish trays, fresh fruit bowl, cranberry sauce, chiffon pumpkin pie, rolls; butter, milk and coffee.

Corps students, civilians and guests will eat at 6:30 in both Sbis and Duncan dining halls. Tables will be complete with candles and other Thanksgiving trimmings.

J. G. Peniston, supervisor of the dining halls, said yesterday 5,200

persons were expected to eat. The following amounts of food will be used for the meal:

5,200 pounds of turkey, 1,400 pounds of corn bread and dressing, 13,000 rolls, 130 gallons of gravy, 2,800 pounds of yams, 1,300 pounds of frozen lima beans, 1,300 pies, 250 pounds of butter, 5,200 pints of milk and 240 gallons of coffee.

Also 1,400 heads of lettuce, 40 gallons of salad dressing, 30 gallons of sweet gherkins, 48 gallons of olives, 20 gallons of pickled onions, eight crates of celery, 14 boxes of apples, eight boxes of oranges, 15 lugs of grapes, 700 pounds of bananas and 120 gallons of cranberry sauce.

Peniston predicted there would be left-overs.

## Century Study Nominated For National Award

The A&M Century Study program has been nominated for a Freedoms Foundation award.

The announcement was made by Kenneth D. Wells, president of the foundation. The nomination will be submitted to the distinguished awards jury for review later this fall when the group convenes at Valley Forge.

Wells said the nomination was made as a result of an "outstanding effort being made by a major college to ascertain its educational program to meet major challenges that face the individual citizen during the next 15 years."

A&M elected during its 85th anniversary, which is also the 100th anniversary of legislation establishing land grant colleges in the United States, to launch the Century Study program.

The state's oldest tax-supported institution of higher learning is one of 69 land grant colleges in the United States.

Freedoms Foundation, a non-profit, non-sectarian, non-political organization, was created in March, 1949, to recognize individuals and groups that strive to emphasize fundamental principles undergirding the American way of life.

Among the officers and trustees of the foundation are Dwight D. Eisenhower, Herbert Hoover, Maj. Gen. Harlan N. Hartness (Ret.) and Admiral Arthur W. Radford (Ret.).

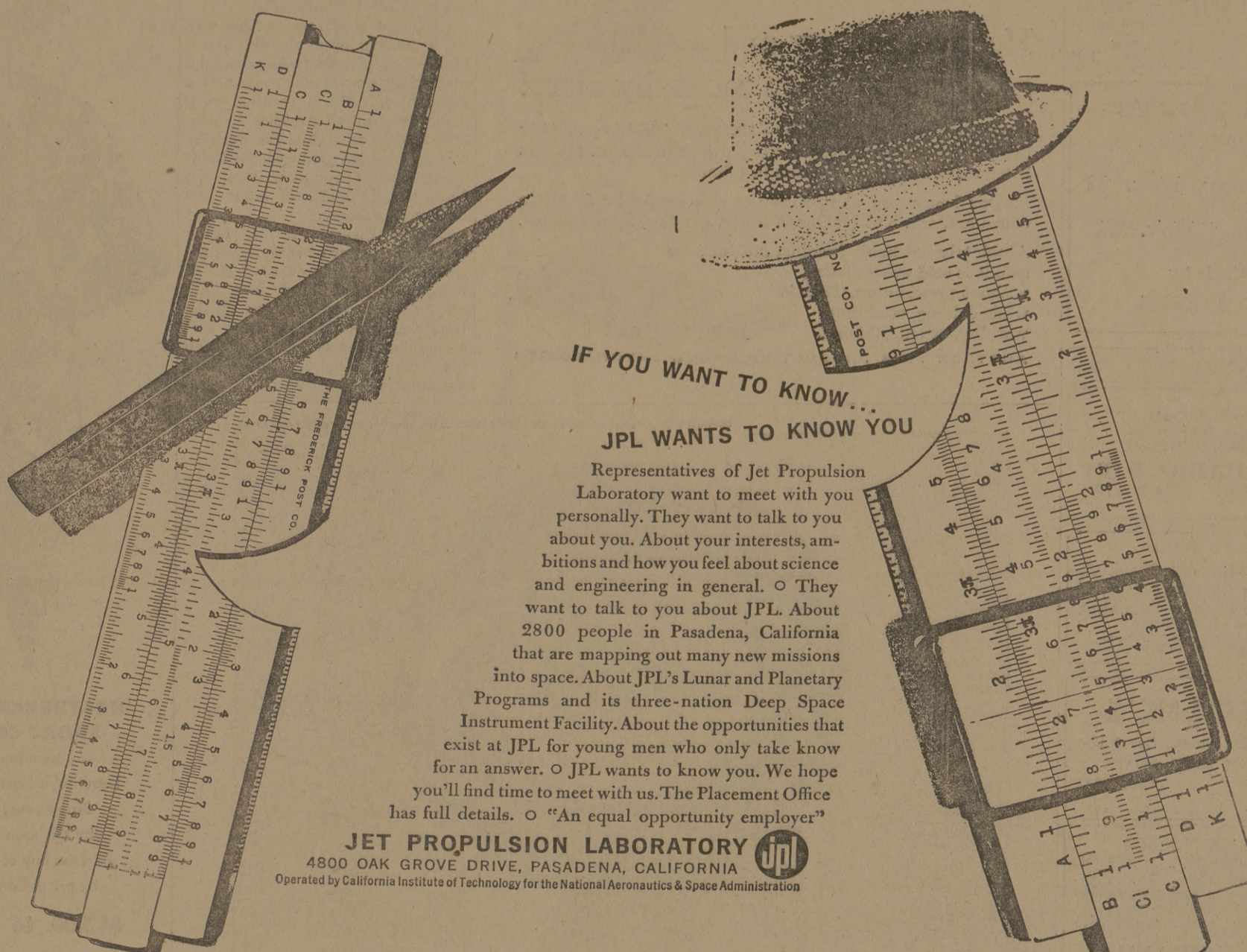
