Battle, Showalter Present Federal Role In Economy

Tonight, SCONA VII will present as its third plenary session a discussion panel consisting of Laurie Battle, representative of the National Association of Manufacturers, and Ralph Showalter, of the AFL-CIO, with the topic "The Role of the Federal Government in the Affairs Of The Economy."

University and later was awarded an honorary Doctor's degree from Birmingham Southern College in 1955.

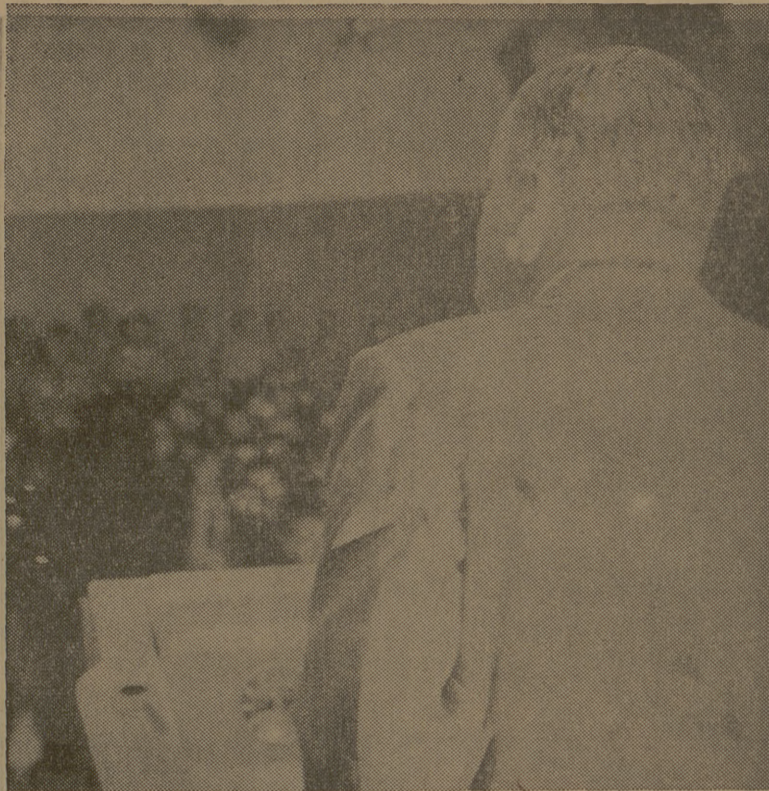
In military service, Battle received the Bronze Star and other decorations for his action in the Philippines, Okinawa and Japan.

After returning from the service he was elected to the United States Congress, remaining there for eight years and serving on such committees as chairman of the "Economic Affairs" subcommittee.

He is the author of the famous "Battle Act." For the past three years he has been a member of the Government Relations Division of the National Association of Manufacturers, specifically in industrial and international relations.

Showalter received his B. S. degree in psychology from the University of Washington in 1939, and has since done graduate work in economics, sociology and labor education at the University of Washington and the University of Chicago.

He is presently a national legislative representative of the United Automotive Workers of America, an organization he has been active in since 1942 when he was a leader in local six at the General Motors plant in Chicago. He has been assistant director for the UAW Research Department, the Political Action Department and the Education Department, plus other various offices in the labor union movement.

New System Eases Laundry Problems

A new 170-foot conveyor system and five shirt folders now in operation enable the A&M laundry to handle 550 shirts per hour, manager James H. Kingcaid said recently.

The system has been in operation since the third week of September. After each shirt is pressed, it is placed on a conveyor hanger for transfer to the folding machine.

In addition to transporting the shirts from one machine to another, the conveyor gives the shirt time to cool. This is important, Kingcaid said, because if the shirts are not allowed to cool before folding, the heat has a tendency to re-press the folded creases into the shirt.

"The conveyor system also gives an opportunity for closer inspection of the shirt before folding and boosts production by approximately 25 per cent," Kingcaid said.

This device plus five relatively new shirt-folding machines enables workmen to press and fold approximately 550 shirts an hour. Kingcaid said the laundry personnel presses and folds from 40,000-45,000 shirts and pants per week in addition to handling ironed sheets and pillowcases.

Kingcaid has been laundry manager at the college for 15 years, and has been working with laundries for 51 years.
