New System Eases Laundry Problems

and five shirt folders now in operation enable the A&M laundry to handle 550 shirts per hour, manager James H. Kingcaid said re-

The system has been in operation since the third week of September. After each shirt is pressed, it is placed on a conveyor hanger for transfer to the folding

In addition to transporting the shirts from one machine to another, the conveyor gives the shirt time to cool. This is important Kingcaid said, because if the shirts are not allowed to cool before folding, the heat has a tendency to re-press the folded creases into the shirt.


