Dr. L. S. Dillon Completing Modern Biology Textbook

Dr. Lawrence S. Dillon, associate professor of biology, is writing what may prove to be the most modern biology text on the market today. The new book will incorporate the latest information on biology and a new method of classification of organisms.
 Three publishing companies have displayed considerable interest, and have submitted bids for the manuscript. Dr. Dillon stated that he expected to receive bids from possibly three other companies.
 He said that there were two reasons behind his decision to write the book.
 "First, there is no satisfactory one-semester biology text on the

market. Second, absolutely no books have incorporated the latest findings on the subject. The content in our biology books has not appreciably changed in 30 or 40 years."
 Not only was the material behind the times, but he was completely dissatisfied with the methods used in teaching biology, he added.
 "Textbooks are slow to incorporate new materials," he said. "Like everything else, they resist change."
 As an example, he stated that upon returning to the academic field after 15 years in museum work, he found that biology texts

had only three changes in them since the time he had left.
 One of the most significant changes in Dr. Dillon's book concerns the relationships of organisms. In all previous books, life was classified under one of two kingdoms—plant or animal. Under the classification system presented in this book, the plant kingdom encompasses all life.
 "Even man is simply a highly modified plant," Dr. Dillon stated.
