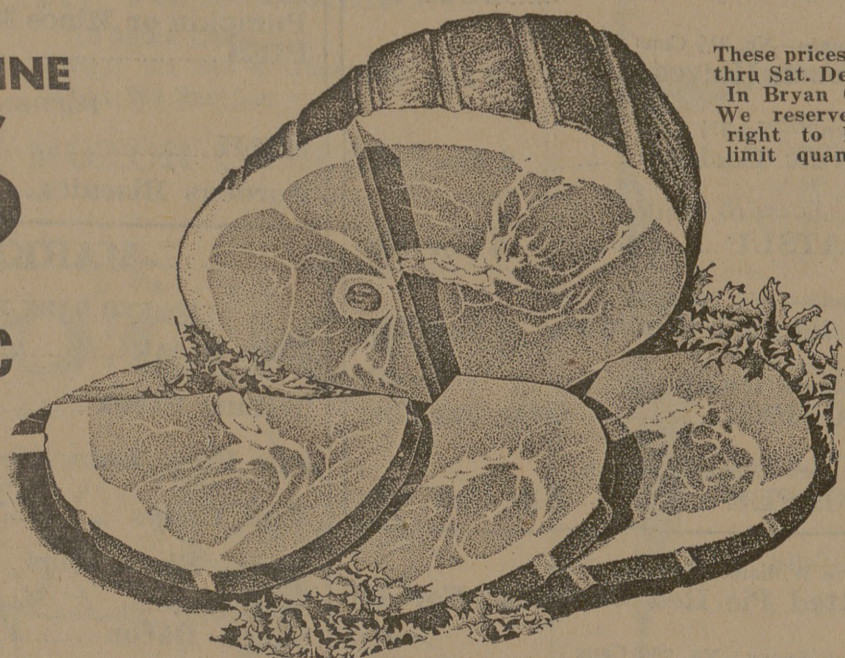

**Dr. Reeves, Wife To Talk
On Egyptian Social Trends**

Dr. Robert G. Reeves of the Department of Genetics and his wife will give an illustrated talk tomorrow on "Social and Economic Development in Modern Egypt."

The program, to be sponsored by the Arab Student Club, is scheduled for 7:30 p.m. in the Social Room of the Memorial Student Center.

Reeves was on leave from A&M last year and served as a visiting Fulbright Professor at the Alexandria University in Alexandria, Egypt.

Dr. Leslie V. Hawkins, of the Department of Industrial Education will exhibit part of his private collection of early colonial tools in the MSC Feb. 28-Mar. 2. Approximately 100 early saws, planes, drills, bits and other colonial

woodworking tools will be displayed.

Howard L. Morton, Robert E. Meyer and Robert A. Darrow of the School of Agriculture are participating in the Weed Society of America's national meeting now under way in St. Louis, Mo.

The group is concerned with personnel interested in use of chemical for weed and plant control in agriculture and industry.

Dr. Jack A. Dabbs, of the Department of Modern Languages, will leave Christmas day for Chicago to attend the annual meeting of the Modern Language Association of America.

At the convention he will attend the Language Laboratory Seminar to learn of new developments in

the use of laboratories for testing.

Dr. Dwain Estes of the Department of Education and Psychology is leaving A&M at the close of this semester to join the University of Alabama faculty.

His post will be filled by Pat Sullivan, now doing graduate work at the University of Texas. Sullivan, married with two children, earned BA and MED degrees at Texas Tech.

Charles A. Rodenberger, associate professor in the Department of Aeronautical Engineering is attending a short course on "Materials Under Thermal Stress" at Pennsylvania State University. The course is being presented by the National Aeronautics and Space Administration.
