Election of officers for 1962 will be a major point of business at the annual meeting of the Association of Former Students to be held in the Memorial Student Center Jan. 27-28.

Retiring as president of the association is James W. Aston, '33 president of the Republic National Bank of Dallas. Frank Harvey, '41, Wichita Falls oilman, will be installed as the new president.

Also, on this date, the 16th annual meeting of A&M Club Officers will be held. The club officers of the 180 A&M Clubs will be invited to the campus to participate in the discussions relating to A&M Club activities.

A third meeting on this date will be the 11th annual Class Agents Conference. According to J. B. Hervey, executive secretary of the Association of Former Students, agents of the 63 organized classes will convene to discuss class participation in the development fund, class reunions, class letters and other class activities.

The total expected attendance for the Jan. 27-28 meetings is 250.

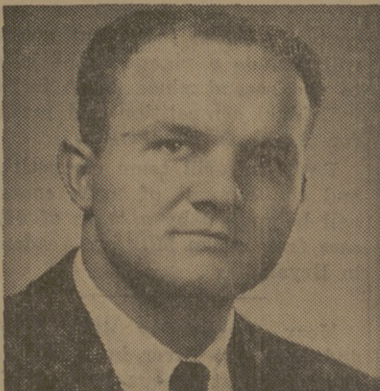
DAVID BEAUCHAMP JR.

Grandma Moses Dies At Age 101

HOOSICK FALLS, N. Y. (AP)—Grandma Moses who took up painting in her 70s and became one of the nation's best known artists, died Wednesday at the age of 101.

The witty, little artist who achieved worldwide fame late in life had been confined to a nursing home, the Hoosick Falls Health Center, since July.

Her physician, Dr. Clayton Shaw, said Grandma died after being in an oxygen tent at the hospital most of the day.

Her death was peaceful, he said, but she had not been conscious during the day.

"She just passed away." Grandma whose full name was Mrs. Anna Mary Robertson Moses, became known to millions through her primitive paintings of rural life in upstate New York, which were reproduced on Christmas cards.
