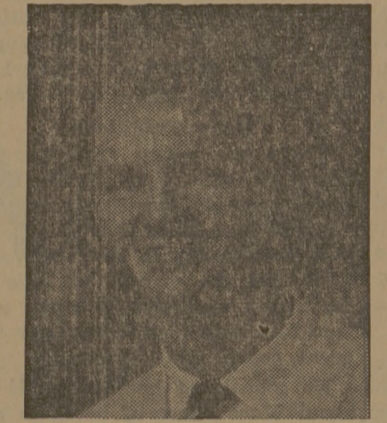
FRANCISCO GARZA
