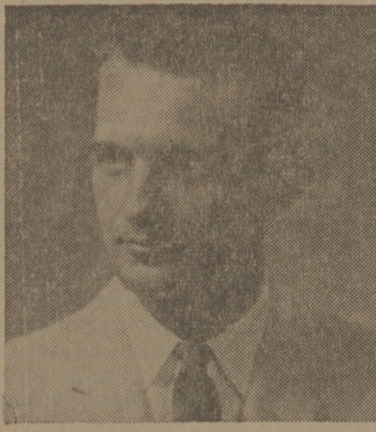


These Aggies Also Selected For Who's Who

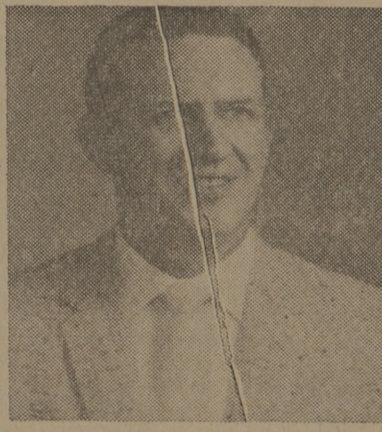
ROBERT SIDNEY SLOAN

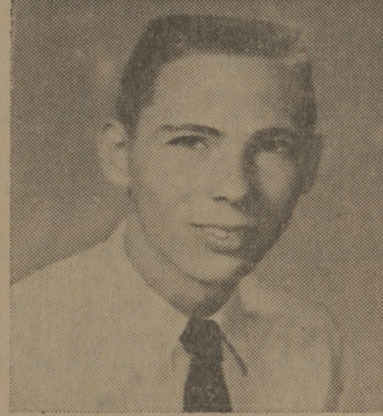
THOMAS HENRY RALPH JR.

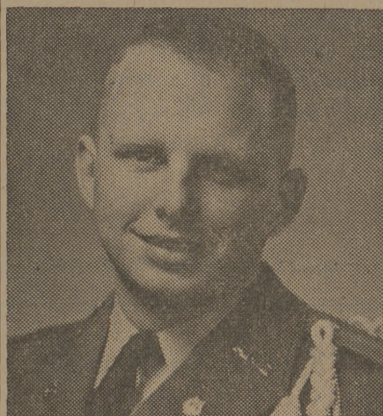
