Peace Corps Exam Set For Feb. 17 At Bryan P. O.

Peace Corps examinations will be held Feb. 17 at the main post office in Bryan at 8:30 a.m. This will be for all agricultural and engineering positions, skilled craftsmen, primary and secondary school teachers, health workers, and most other positions. Latest revised application forms may be obtained from the Placement Office or Daniel Russell, Room 316-17, Agriculture Building.

Applicants neither pass nor flunk the exam, Russell said. It is merely to get one profile of the applicants.

The morning part of the exam should take about four and one-half hours; the afternoon part about one hour. Those expecting to go to work this spring or summer should apply and take the examination now, Russell said.

House Okays Boost In US Postal Rates

WASHINGTON (AP)—The House passed and sent to the Senate yesterday a postal rate increase bill that would cost users of the mails \$690 million a year more.

Most of the increased cost would fall to business firms. The Post Office Department estimates the average family would pay only \$140 more each year if the 4-cent letter goes to 5 cents, as proposed.

Senate passage of some form of rate increase bill is considered certain, but there may be cuts in the higher second- and third-class rates voted by the House.

The new rate bill is expected to end the perennial post office deficit but there were indications such an achievement, if reached, may be short-lived. Sen. Olin D. Johnston, D-S.C., chairman of the Senate Post Office Committee, scheduled hearings Feb. 7 on a bill to raise the pay of federal

workers, including postal employees.

The House-passed bill would apply 1-cent increases across the board in first-class and airmail items. In addition to the new letter rate of 5 cents, it would raise postcards from 3 to 4 cents, airmail letters from 7 to 8 cents and airmail cards from 5 to 6 cents.

These increases would raise \$455 million of the total new revenue in the bill, the rest coming from higher rates for newspapers, magazines and advertising material.

Passage was by voice vote three minutes after the House met. There was no debate and no recurrence of the angry opposition voiced by many members Tuesday night when the leadership abruptly cut off debate. Only a few scattered "no's" were heard when the vote was taken.

IAS To Tour Two Texas Industries

The A&M chapter of the Institute of Aerospace Sciences has scheduled its annual field trip for Feb. 9, when its members journey to Marshall, Tex., to tour the Longhorn Division of Thiokol Chemical Corp. and Clark Aircraft Co.

In touring Thiokol Chemical Corp., the IAS members will observe the production and testing facilities for building the solid propellant engines used in U.S. Army Nike and Sergeant missiles. The students will also view a static test firing of a rocket engine.

The tour of Clark Aircraft Co., which produces bi-planes for agri-

cultural use as well as sub-contracting for other light plane manufacture, will include the complete manufacturing facilities. An aerial demonstration is also scheduled, weather permitting.

The A&M chapter of IAS is open not only to students of the Department of Aeronautical Engineering but also to all engineering and science students interested in the aero-space sciences.
