Record Miler Wants Shorter Distance In LA

AUCKLAND, New Zealand (AP)—Peter Snell, new world recordholder for the mile, said Tuesday he does not want to run that distance at an indoor meet in Los Angeles Feb. 10.

He made the statement in commenting on reports that organizers of the meet had switched original plans to enter him in the 600 or 1,000 yards and planned to run him in the mile.

Snell said: "As far as I am concerned, I accepted the shorted distance and that is what I will be running. It seems the organizers have made the change only after I broke the mile record. I had not wanted to run another hard mile race this season."

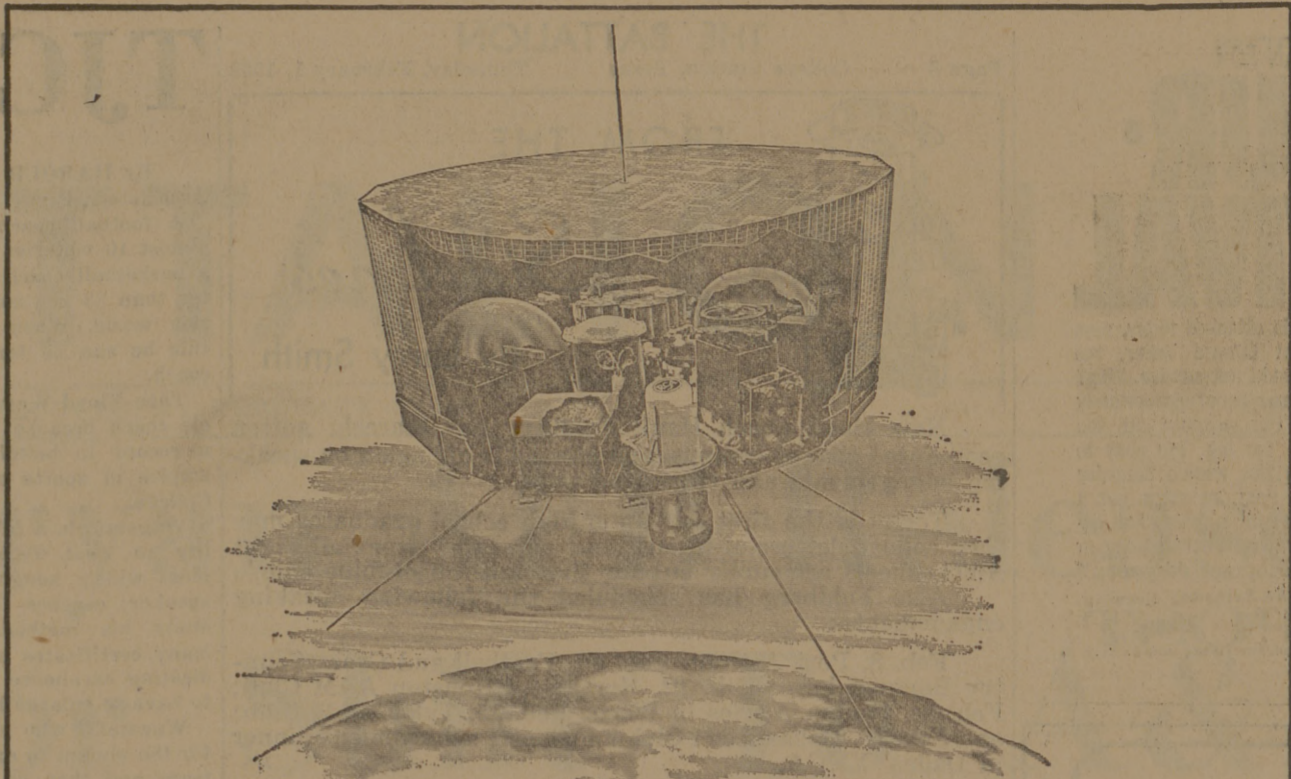
Saxton Signs Pro Contract

DALLAS (AP)—James Saxton, the All-America back from the University of Texas, signed yesterday to play with the Dallas Texans of the American Football League.

Saxton, also drafted by the St. Louis Cardinals of the National Football League, is considered small for a pro player. He weighs 165 and is 5 feet 11.

But he is a scat runner who set a record for yardage at the University of Texas with 847 in 107 carries for an average of 7.91.

Texas had a 10-1 record this year, and the one loss was on a day when Saxton sat out most of the game with an injury. The loss was to TCU.
