

### Museum of Sports Names Chairman

NEW YORK — (AP) — Robert Kiphuth, former coach of the Yale University and U. S. Olympic swimming teams, Wednesday was named chairman of the fund-raising committee for the National Art Museum of Sport.

A national drive will be conducted for memberships in the hope of building and adorning a museum dedicated to perpetuating the great works of art surrounding sports.

The purpose of the museum is to foster a wider appreciation of art through the medium of the public's interest in sports and the creation of works of art with an athletic theme.

The founder and president of the project is Germain G. Glidden, prominent New York portrait painter who formerly was the national squash rackets champion and Harvard tennis captain.

Now that the Aggie basketballers are tied for the South-west Conference lead, people around the campus have suddenly gotten the basketball fever—you can see the title flag waving in their eyes.

The SWC is its usual round-robin cutthroat that it has been in the past. League-leaders were crushed and the runners-up received the same fate last Tuesday night—that is all except the Aggies, who dropped a runner-up (Rice) in Tuesday's tilt. Texas Tech, the leader which is now tied with the Ags for the top position, lost its first game in Lubbock since February 1960 as the pesky TCU Horned Frogs played their familiar role of upsetting the favorite just like their schoolmates, the football players.

In other action Texas lost a thriller to the SMU Mustangs in Dallas and the lowly Baylor Bears edged the Arkansas Hogs in another thriller.

The Gadets travel to Dallas this Saturday for a very important meeting with the Ponies. With only seven games remaining this season, the Aggies have three on the road—SMU, Texas Tech and Rice.

A&M's big men—Carroll Broussard and Jerry Windham—turned in their finest performance of the season Tuesday night against Rice. Broussard shot 16 times and hit on eight of them while Windham attempted 10 field goals and made good on five. Carroll added 10 points on free throws and Jerry hit on seven charity tosses.

For SWC play Windham is hitting .533 per cent from the field and Broussard has a .407 average.

Jim Brewer, graduate student and former Aggie javelin thrower and cross country coach, remarked before the Rice game that Broussard was really going to have a good game against the Owls because this was the first game he had seen all season. Broussard had his best game of the winter (26 points) and Brewer vowed that he was coming to the remaining of the Aggie home games.

## Eleven Ink Pacts

When Coach Hank Foldberg and his staff arrived on the A&M campus, they immediately went to work on recruiting the outstanding football prospects in Texas. Through Monday, Feb. 5, they had signed 11. They are:

Lenward Caraway, a 6-0, 197-pound guard from DeLeon who was honorable mention all-state and three times all-district.

Glen Lindsey, a 5-10, 175-pound quarterback from Mineral Wells. Lindsey was honorable mention all-state, twice all-district and a member of the Wigwam Wisemen of America All-America squad.

Ray Patterson, a 6-0, 190-pound tackle from Mineral Wells, who was an all-district performer.

Mike Farhat, a 6-1, 210-pound all-district tackle from Arlington.

Tom Overstreet, a 6-5, 210-pound all-district tackle from Austin (Austin High).

Clifton Byrd, a 6-5, 220-pound all-district end from Pleasanton.

Dennis Callaway, a 6-1, 215-pound tackle from Sweeny. Callaway was all-state last fall and was three times all-district.

Thomas Byer, a 6-0, 190-pound fullback from Marlin. Byer was Super-Center (Waco News-Tribune) and all-district. He is the brother of Aggie fullback Sam Byer.

Ken Caffey, a 5-11, 180-pound fullback from Thorndale. Caffey was all-district and is the brother of Aggie fullback Lee Roy Caffey.

Bill McBryde, a 6-2, 210-pound fullback from Shamrock.

Wayne Johnson, a 6-1, 215-pound tackle from Dallas (Samuell).

John Sellers led Chicago jockeys in stakes wins in 1961 with eight, one more than Bill Hartack.
