

# Ags Stay In 1st Place; Crush Frogs, 87-65

Behind the tremendous field goal shooting of Carroll Broussard and Tommy Smith plus the brilliant rebounding of Jerry Windham, the Aggies cagers coasted an easy Southwest Conference victory over the TCU Horned Frogs, 87-65.

With the win, the Cadets remained tied for the first position in the SWC as Texas Tech and SMU won their respective games Saturday night. Each have a 7.3 mark.

The "gold-dust twins," Broussard and Smith, together, hit on 20 out of 30 field goal attempts. Broussard, who was high for the game with 29 points (his top performance of the year), made good on 12 out of 19 while Smith

hit on eight out of 11. Smith was runner-up to Broussard in scoring with 18 points.

Broussard personally knocked the Frogs out of a 1-3-1 zone in the first half with his high-arching jump shot from deep in the corner. Smith came forth with his starring shooting in the second half.

While the "gold-dust twins" were popping the nets, Windham was grabbing the most rebounds off the boards of any Aggie this season — 19. Along with his 19 rebounds, Windham also racked up 16 points.

In the field goal percentage department, the Aggies led with a 51.4 average (36 out of 70) while TCU was hitting on 26 out of 60 attempts for a 43.3 per cent. A&M led in rebounds with 56 to 29 for TCU.

TCU's star playmaker and top scorer in the SWC with a 21.4 average, Phil Reynolds, stayed almost up to his conference average as he dropped in 21 points.

The Horned Frogs started out in the lead, which seems to be the usual custom of visitors to the

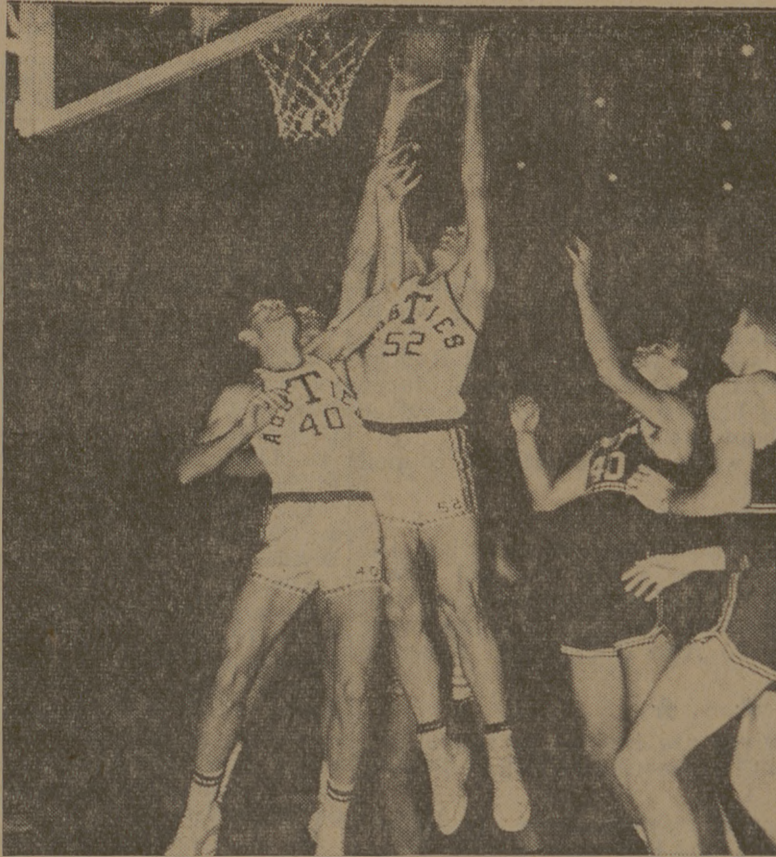
G. Rollie White Coliseum, and led as much as 7-2 before the Aggies started closing the gap. With 12:57 left in the first half, the Aggies knotted the score at 9-9 on a jump shot by Smith. At this point, Broussard started his assault on TCU's goal and the score at the end of the first half was 40-29. Broussard had half of his team's 40 points at the intermission.

In the second half, the Aggies continued their outstanding shooting and slowly increased the margin over the Frogs. Mid-way in the second half, Smith put on a dazzling show as he made 10 straight points on five field goals.

The pressure isn't off the Aggies yet. Tonight in Houston they engage in a "must" battle with the Rice Owls. The Owls are out of the SWC race since they have lost five games, but they can still upset the leaders. Rice Coach Johnnie Frankie said, "Somebody else is going to get upset before the season is over."

This could be a warning to the Aggies and the Red Raiders.

## Fish Edge Wogs

After trailing the entire ball game, and by a considerable margin during the first half, Coach Shelby Metcalf's Fish basketballers staged a comeback victory over the TCU Wogs Saturday night, 57-56.

Benny Phillips' only two points of the game, a pair of free throws, were the most important of the game for A&M as they dropped with 16 seconds remaining in the game to put the Fish across the wire first.

The Aggie frosh appeared to hang on quite well until midway in the first period when Pat Peebles and Don Hoyt of the Wogs started sinking shots with a regularity that left the Fish trailing, 35-26 at the half.

It was a different story when the second period began, however, with the Fish closing the

gap by leaps and bounds. Midway in the second half, the Fish copied the lead momentarily, only to lose it until the final seconds.

The remainder of the second half was a see-saw build-up of points for each team with the Wogs ahead by a few all the time. Holt committed his fifth foul with only seconds left in the contest, though, and Phillips dropped his two charity shots to put the Fish ahead, 57-56.

Game high-point man was Fish center Tim Timmerman, who turned in a respectable total of 21. He was also the best rebounder with 10.

Holt was high man for the Wogs with 18 points. Archie Clayton of the TCU frosh was the second best rebounder of the game with 9.
