In his letter, Wilke agreed with a statement made last week by Attorney General Robert Kennedy that the Mexican War was unnecessary. His last paragraph should have read:

"I believe that by using our economic and military power to keep nations out of the UN, to force so-called 'free' nations to actively support NATO and SEATO, to persuade others to do the fighting while we do the training — I believe that by doing these things, we are just picking for a fight.
