

Goldthwaite Steer Tops Houston Show

HOUSTON (AP)—Horton's Price, 1,040-pound Hereford owned by Jerry Duren, 18, Goldthwaite, was judged the grand champion fat steer of the 30th Houston Livestock Show Thursday night.

It was the sixth time for a Mills County entry to win the top award of the Houston show. Duren's prize animal will be sold at auction Friday morning. Young Duren is expected to receive at least \$10,000 for the Hereford he raised on a town lot in Goldthwaite. Last year's grand champion sold for \$12,000. The Houston record is the \$18,800 Johnny Wigley, also of Goldthwaite, received for his 1953 grand champion.

The victory by Horton's Pride marked the twenty-fourth time for a Hereford to win the show.

Russell, Rodenberger Get Two Top National Positions

Daniel Russell, professor of rural sociology in the Department of Economics and Sociology, has been elected to full membership in the National Academy of Certified Social Workers in New York.

Requirements for membership are approved, educational training, years of approved social service experience, plus years of membership in the parent organization The National Association of Social Workers

The parent organization itself has strict membership requirements. Only a small per cent of those engaged professionally in the

field qualify for membership. The general purpose of the NACSW is to give status to qualified members and to raise standards and level of work in the expanding field of sociology.

Among the privileges granted to academy members is authority to use the NACSW after the name on business cards, letterheads, office doors, signatures on letters, etc.

Charles A. Rodenberger, associate professor of aeronautical engineering, has been named to the Educational Advisory Committee

of the National Institute of Aerospace Sciences.

This committee has the responsibility of formulating policy for future IAS educational and student service programs and is comprised of men from the aerospace industries and educational institutions.

Rodenberger is currently serving on the state committee for education of the Texas Society of Professional Engineers.

Heavy Duty Rescue Class Meets On Disaster Street

A 5½-day heavy duty rescue class for disaster situations is being conducted here by the Engineering Extension Service. The class began Monday and ends Saturday, according to Robert O. Boriskie, information representative.

This week's class is the 15th in a series. Its objectives are to operate a training program for instructors in rescue operations, to

develop maximum efficiency of rescue teams, and to develop a nucleus for state-wide rescue service.

The Engineering Extension Service is cooperating with the Texas Education Agency, and its school is coordinated with the Division of Defense and Disaster Relief of the state governor's office. Equipment is provided by the Federal Civil Defense Administration, the State of Texas, and A&M.

Henry D. Smith, chief of the Fireman's Training School and the Rescue Training School, heads a staff of six instructors. They are teaching rescue skills to 17 members of various agencies such as police departments, fire departments, and civil defense organizations which are concerned with natural, man-made, and accidental disasters.

Each day of first aid, equipment, and rescue instructions is divided into morning, evening, and night sessions which are conducted in the field, in the class room, and in a simulated disaster area.

The realistic disaster area includes a large specially-built demolished building located on Disaster Street near the Hensel Apartments. Disaster Street provides realistic experience with removing casualties from wreckage, traveling through debris-littered areas, and radio communications with other rescue agencies.

The week-long school ends Saturday noon with a graduation ceremony and a presentation of certificates.
