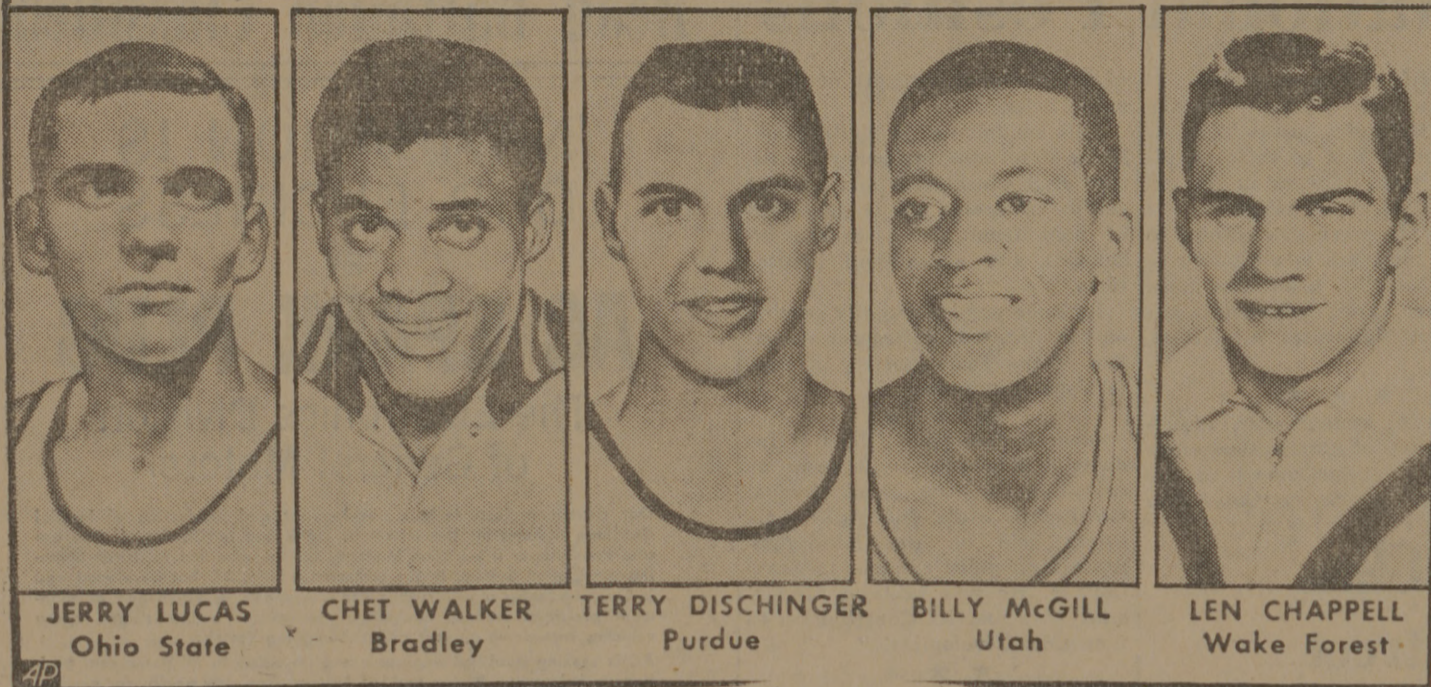


1962 AP ALL-AMERICA



Saturday is supposed to be a big day for sports at Aggieland, but the weather may have something to say about the happenings. On the agenda is a baseball game, the opener for the 1962 Aggies, with the University of Dallas Crusaders. Game time has been set for 2 p.m. on Kyle Field, but there is some speculation whether the game will ever take place. If the game is postponed, Coach Tom Chandler's baseballers will open the season on March 6 with a contest with Texas Lutheran on Kyle Field. Another spectacular set for Saturday afternoon is the triangular track meet matching the Aggies against teams from Rice and Texas. Field events will start at 2 p.m. and races at 2:30. Three Aggie sprinters — Ed Williams, Pat Mitchell and Curtis Roberts — are not scheduled to run in the specialties. Coach Hank Foldberg's football team will begin spring training Monday, it was announced today. This week had been set as a starting week for the drills, but the weather cancelled all workouts. Harry (Mike) Link will cap Notre Dame's 1962 football team. He's a fullback from Chicago.

Broussard has been the greatest thing to happen to Aggie basketball since the reign of Neil Swisher in 1957-59. He breaks his own scoring record every time he makes a point and holds all of the A&M individual scoring records. In 70 varsity games, the Port...

Arthur whiz has punished the cords for 1,351 points, and average of 19.3 per game. The old record, set by Swisher, was 984 points.

Broussard is the second leading scorer for a season in SWC history. He achieved this record in 1960-61 by scoring 339 points in 14 games, a 24.2 average. The leader in this category is Dick O'Neil of TCU who scored 362 in conference play in 1954-55.

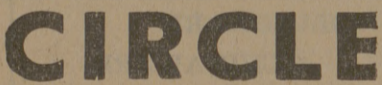

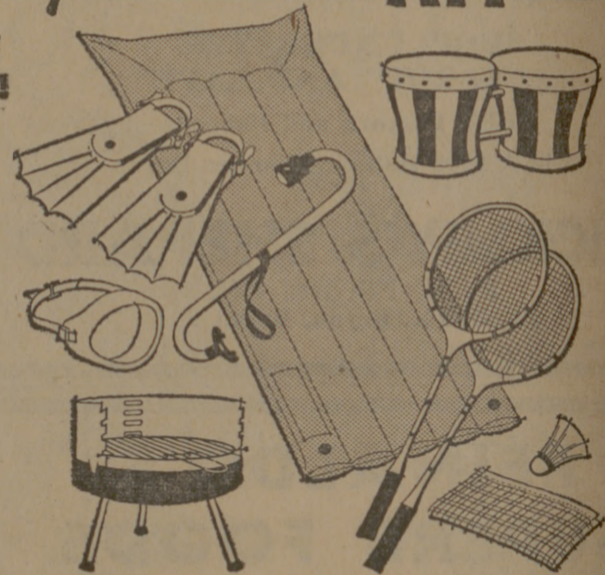
