

Open Gym Meet Ends

The first open gymnastics meet in the history of intramural athletics at A&M was completed last night after the judging of routines on the high bar and trampoline. A rope climb event was also timed last night as part of the meet. Routines on the parallel bars, side horse and free exercise mat were graded Wednesday night. Also on Wednesday night was the vaulting on the long horse.

The Rockport lad started things off right Wednesday night by taking first in the parallel bars and the long horse vaulting. His routine on the rings, the third event, won him a second place. Last night, he took first in the high bar competition.

Another standout in the meet was a Bryan product from F-3. On Wednesday night, Pinky Carll took firsts in the rings and side horse competition. He had two seconds also; in the long horse vaulting and free exercise.

Winner in the free exercise Wednesday night was George Sprague of Sqd. 13.

The first event in last night's competition was the timed rope climb. Contestants were required to start in a sitting position and climb a 20-foot rope, using only their hands. When the contestant touches the wooden disk at the 20-foot level on the rope, time is stopped.

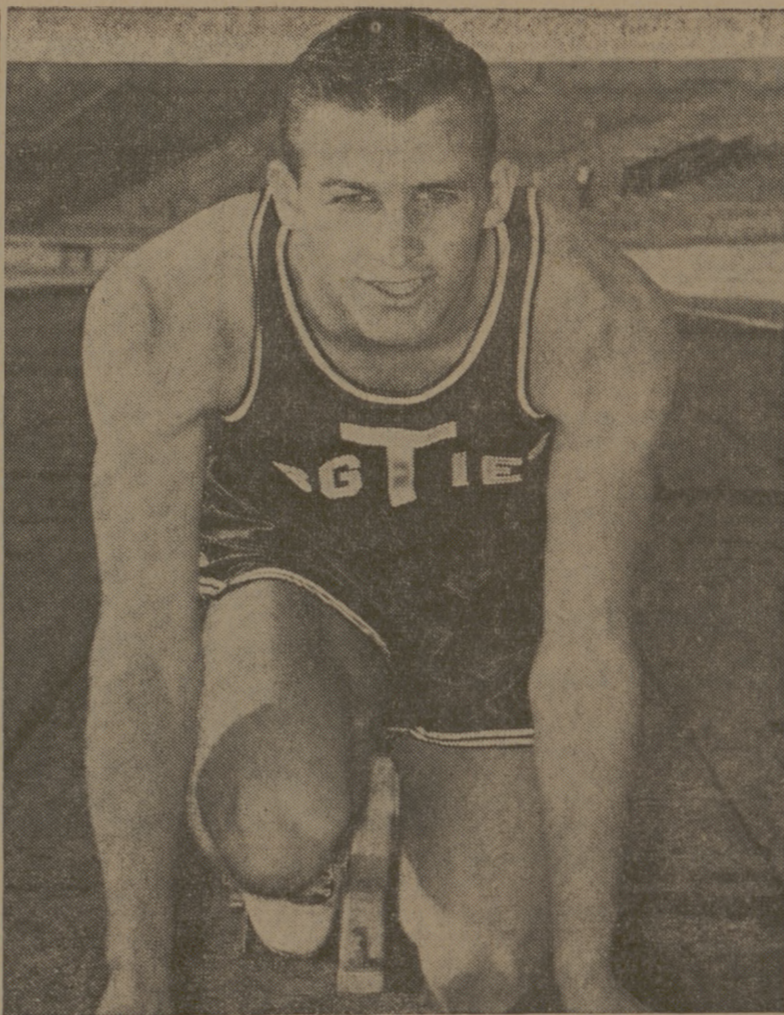
Results of the rope climb were: C. H. Crawford of Sqd. 8 first with a time of 10.7 seconds. In second place was Ben Martinez of A-3 with a time of 16.3. The other two entries' hands slipped in their attempts and they were forced to withdraw because of lost time.

The next scheduled event was tumbling but there were no on-the-spot entries and those who had entered previously failed to show up.

Only two men entered the difficult competition of the horizontal high bar. Tom McCabe managed to edge J. Y. Humber of A-3 by a slim three-tenths of a point. McCabe's score was 13.3.

The last event was an 8-bounce routine on the trampoline. None of the four entries was satisfied with their first-round performance, so a second try was allowed for all contestants.

M. L. Patton of C-3 came back, after having the lowest score on the first round, to win the event with 13.6 points. John Killingsworth, the first round leader, took second with 10.9. McCabe took third with 10.6 and W. P. Matthews of the White Band was fourth with 7.8.

Broussard Again On All-SWC Team

For the third successive year, Aggie forward Carroll Broussard has been chosen as a member of the All-Southwest Conference basketball team. The 6-5 senior from Port Arthur was honored Tuesday night in G. Rollie White, with a plaque indicating the student body's gratitude for his four years service here.

The all-conference basketball team consists of six men this year because the coaches, while agreeing on the top four players, of whom Broussard was a member,

could not get together on the fifth. The choices were: Jan Loudermilk of SMU, Del Ray Mounts and Harold Hudgens of Texas Tech, Broussard, Phil Reynolds of TCU and Jerry Carlton of Arkansas.

Broussard got all but one of the votes in the coaches' selection. Mounts and Loudermilk were unanimous choices.

Broussard has broken every scoring record at A&M. He wound up fourth in scoring this season in the conference behind Loudermilk, Carlton and Reynolds.

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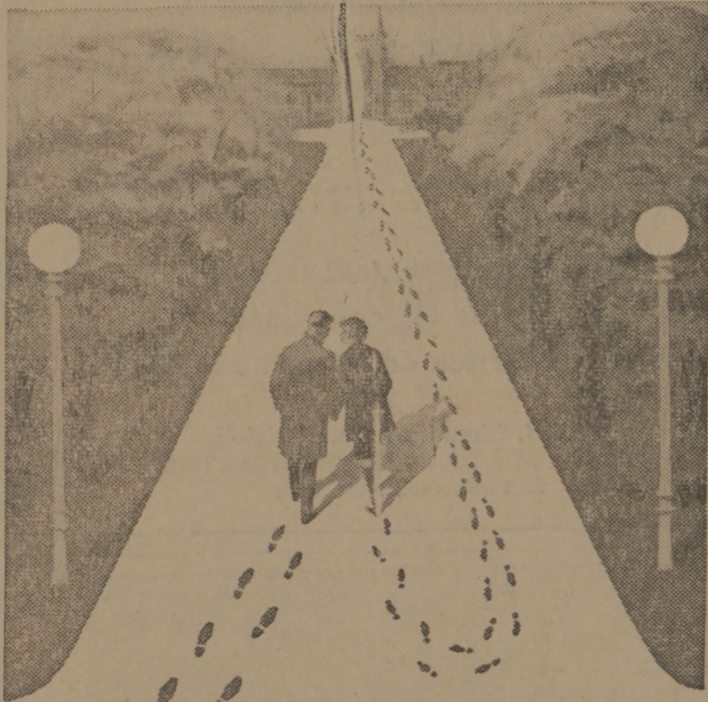
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Bryan Sports Car Races Postponed

If there are any pre-sale tickets there will be a refund by contacting Searcy Edens at 1904 S. College Ave.

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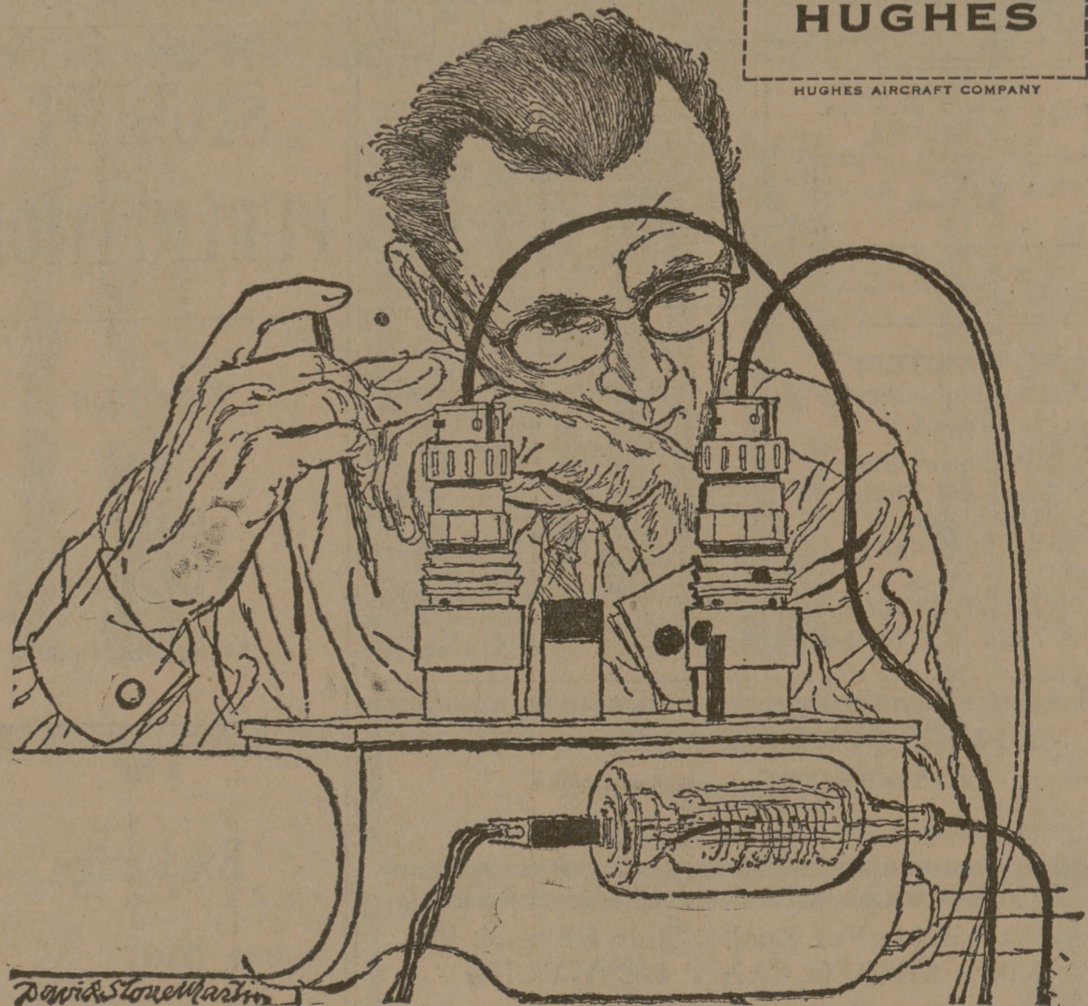
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
