Patterson To Sign With Sonny Liston

NEW YORK (AP)-Floyd Patterson will sign Friday for a defense of his world heavyweight title against Sonny Liston.

Promoter Tom Bolan of Championship Sports Inc., said Patterson's attorney, Julius November, had informed him that the champion would sign Friday afternoon, probably in New York.

The announcement just beat the deadline set by the NBA for a poll of its members to decide if Patterson should lose his title for failing to defend against an approved challenger within a year.
