62 Students Taking Courses In Education Night Program

Sixty-two graduate students are enrolled in the Department of Education and Psychology's evening program this semester.

John Lucas, graduate assistant in the Department of Education and Psychology, said in a recent report that the course offerings are in school administration, supervision, counseling, advanced methods of teaching and educational leadership.

His study showed that 51 of the students are education majors, seven are industrial education majors, two are sociology majors, one is majoring in English and one in agricultural education. Evening students have attended 26 different colleges and universities in the state, and 16 in other states.

The following undergraduate teaching fields are represented in the program, Lucas reported: physical education, social studies,

business, agricultural education, engineering graphics, journalism, mathematics, religion, industrial education, graphic arts, speech, English, biology, history, science,

Dr. Whitmore Opens April Nuclear Engineering Talks

Dr. F. C. Whitmore of the Jet Propulsion Lab in California will speak about "Containment of Magnetic Fields in Super Conducting Material" in a seminar sponsored by the Department of Nuclear Engineering Apr. 6.

The seminar will be in Room 146 of the Physics Building at 3 p.m.

Also speaking will be Dr. H. J. Stein of the Sandia Corporation of Albuquerque, N.M. His topic

will be "Radiation Damage in Crystalline Solids."

Other seminars to be held during April will include "Determination of the Period-Activity Relation and Open-Loop Reactor Transfer from Rod-Drop Decay Data," by R. E. Carille Apr. 13.

C. M. Whitehead's topic Apr. 27 will be "Engineering Design Features of the U.S.A.F. PM-1 Power Reactor."

Nuclear Physics Expert Sets Talk Here On April 4

Dr. C. W. Tittle, chairman, Department of Mechanical Engineering at SMU, will speak Apr. 4 in the All-Faiths Chapel.

Tittle will speak on "Man's Purpose in Life" at 7:30. The general public is invited.

Tittle has his Ph.D. in nuclear physics from Massachusetts Institute of Technology. He did some of the early definitive work in neutron physics during and immediately after World War II. Two of his early papers have been designated by the National Association of Geologists and Geophysicists as classics in their specialty.

His appearance is being sponsored by the Chapel Committee, the YMCA, Interfaith Council, the Newman Club, Student Christian Federation, Rabbi Henry A. Cohen Award, B'nai Brith Hillel Foundation and Gamma Delta.
