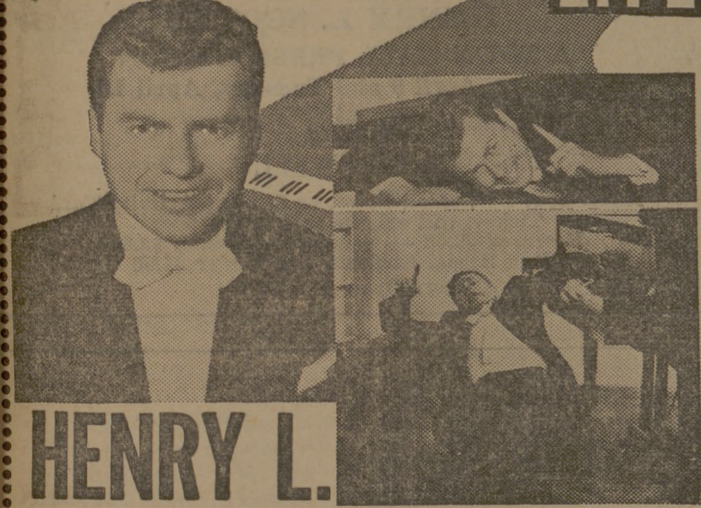

Research Engineers Complete Traffic Speed Factor Study

Neilon J. Rowan and Charles J. Keese, research engineers of the Texas Transportation Institute at A&M have conducted a study of factors influencing traffic speeds.

The work was sponsored cooperatively by the Texas Transportation Institute and the Texas Highway Department. The over-all objectives of the project were (1) to evaluate the effectiveness of speed limits established by present practices and (2) to develop new or more substantial criteria for the establishment of speed zones.

The study techniques used to

measure speeds in transition areas were measurement of the average speed of each vehicle through each of several sectors of the transition zone. The studies pointed up several roadway and development characteristics which influenced traffic speeds. The most significant were curves, sight distance, changes in roadway cross section, commercial development, and appearance of residential development.

Variations in traffic speeds according to the hour of the day or night were also analyzed, as was the effect of radar enforcement on traffic speeds.

Boy, 14, Kills Parents After Flunking English

PHILADELPHIA (AP) — A teenage high school freshman, fearing to tell his parents he had flunked an English course and unhappy over their nagging to improve his scholastic standing, shot and killed his father and mother Monday as they slept.

North Philadelphia home found plasterer, and his wife, Elizabeth, Stephen Joanni, 50, a painter and 53, dead in adjoining twin beds.

Police said the boy's deed was disclosed in a sobbing statement to his parish priest.

Sgt. Frank Brennan of the Homicide Division said the boy apparently planned the killings last Friday when he took his father's pistol and some cartridges and hid them in a bureau in his own bedroom.

This morning, Brennan quoted the boy as saying, "I took the gun and decided to do it."
