

# Fencing, Volleyball Near End

Six men are left after the series of direct-elimination bouts in the foil division of the open intramural fencing tournament. Semi-final and final playoffs in upperclassman volleyball will be held this afternoon and tonight. Class A softball competition got underway Tuesday with 15 games. Chuso Galindo, Juan Terrassa,

In less important clean-up competition in upperclassman volleyball Tuesday, F-3 beat Sqd. 13, 11-5 and 11-8. Mitchell Hall defeated Milner, 11-4 and 11-4; the Vet Students beat the College Apartments, 11-5, 6-11 and 11-4, and Leggett Hall defeated the Hart Civilians, 9-11, 11-1 and 11-9.

In upperclassman softball Tuesday, B-2 and A-3 fought to a 4-4 tie on the lighted diamond. A-2 edged G-2, 11-10, D-3 blasted B-3, 17-2, E-2 got past C-2, 5-2 and E-3 shut out C-3, 9-0.

D-2 beat F-2, 5-3, Sqd. 13 shut out Sqd. 8, 11-0, D-1 beat G-3, 6-3, B-1 shut out Sqd. 3, 9-0.

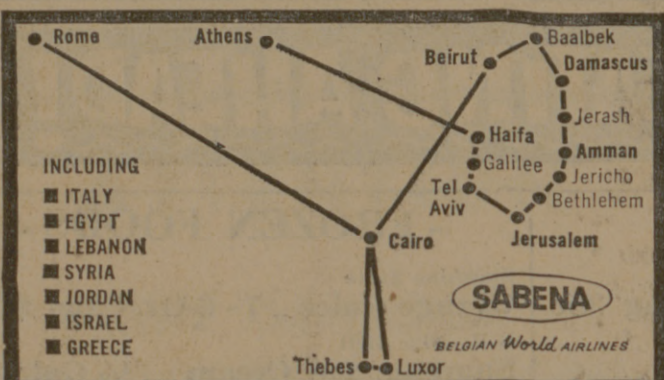

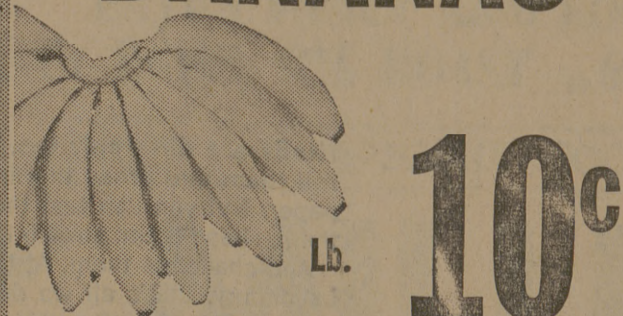
