Palmer Favored

SAN ANTONIO, Tex. (AP)—Arnold Palmer, who has won more tournaments and more money than anybody else this year, is favored to take his third straight Texas Open starting Thursday. If he succeeds it'll be a record for the 38-year-old golf event.

Palmer heads a field of 130 professionals and 20 amateurs.

There never was a stronger field after money in the \$30,000 event. Winners of 16 of the 21 tournaments played thus far this year will be on hand. The only missing ones will be Bo Wininger, Tommy Jacobs, Henry Williams and Billy Casper.

E. L. Ener, junior distance man from Jasper, has been one of Track Coach Charlie Thomas' top men for the past two years. Ener recently set the A&M school record in the 3000-meter steeplechase at the Texas Relays with a time of 9:14.2. He also runs the mile and two-mile for the Aggies.

Ags Have Set 7 School Records

Coach Charlie Thomas' track teams, both varsity and freshman, are having a good year as far as breaking school records are concerned.

Through 11 meets, the teams have cracked seven A&M school records.

Thad Crooks set the 880-yard run mark at the Dallas Invitational with a 1:51.4, 1.4 seconds under the old record. The sprint-medley relay team of Jerry Anderson, Ed Williams, George Tedford and Crooks ran the mile in 3:21.4 at the Texas Relays.

E. L. Ener set the 3000-meter steeplechase at the Texas Relays with a clocking of 9:14.2.

Danny Roberts, the sophomore musclem, set the shot put mark in a meet with Texas and Rice with a toss of 57-1/2. His put is 1/2 inch over Darrow Hooper's Olympic Trials mark.

Freshman sensation Ted Nelson has already set two school marks—the 100-yard dash with a time of 9.4 at the Odessa Invitational and the 440-yard dash last week in a meet with Rice and SMU. His open 440 was run in 46.8, .7 under the old mark.

The final school record broken was the pole vault by another freshman, Lewis Poland. Poland leaped 14-0 1/2 at the Texas Relays and broke the A&M mark by a quarter of an inch.

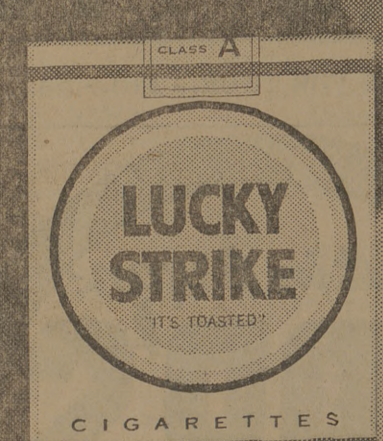
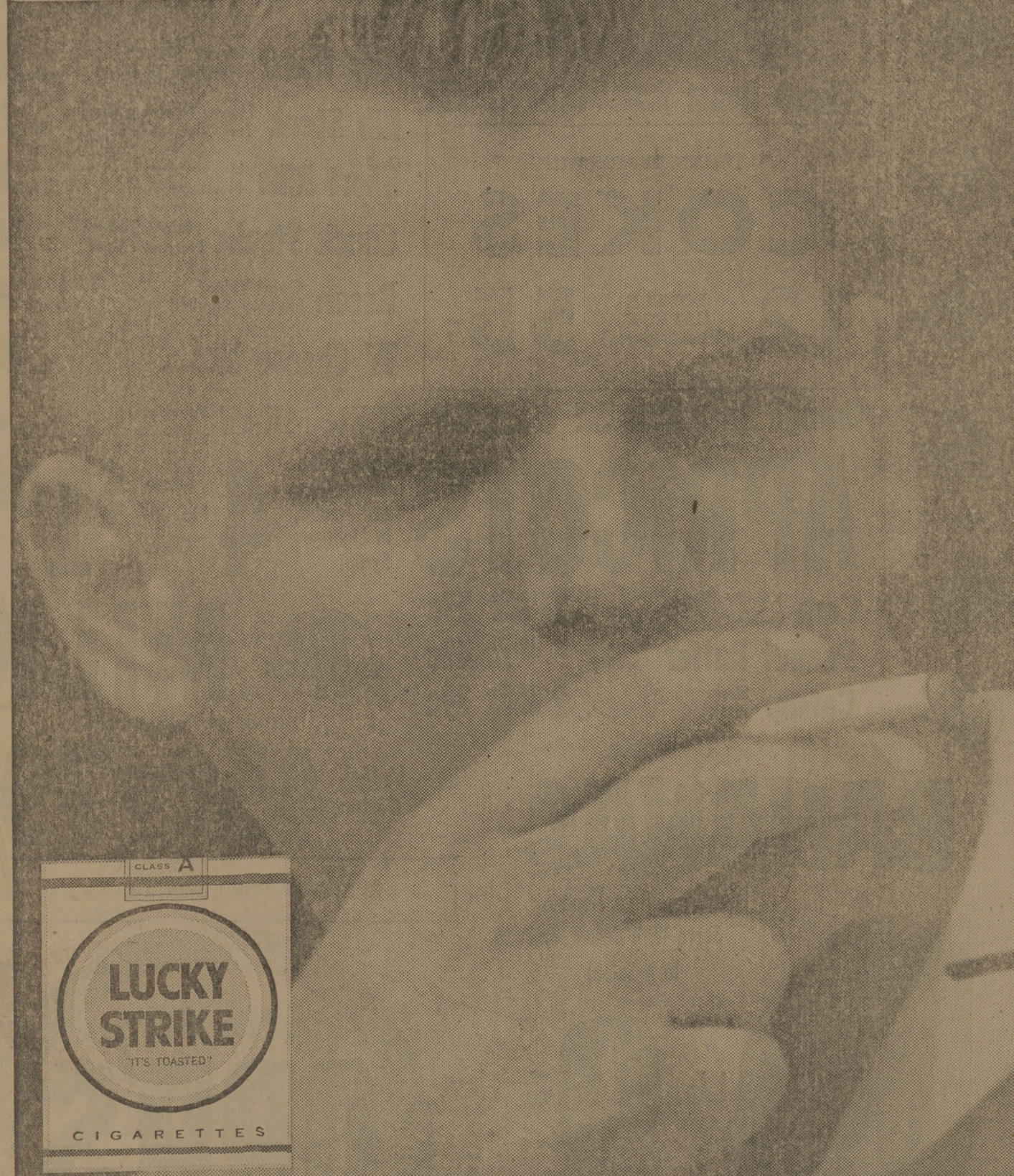
