

Coaches See Bright Future

Baseball coach Tom Chandler and track coach Charlie Thomas are both already eyeing the spring of 1963 with enthusiasm.

Returning to their squads will be the nuclei of two of the best spring sports teams in Aggie history.

One would have to leaf through many a page of archives to find an Aggie baseball team as young

yet as colorful as the one this season.

And, except for leg injuries to four key performers, Thomas might be the reigning coach in SWC track.

The Aggie baseballers compiled records of 18-7 for the season and 11-4 inside the conference. Against champion Texas and other SWC foes, Chandler started six sophomores, not counting his three sophomores. Frank Stark at first base, Bill Grochett at second, Bill Hancock at third, David Johnson at shortstop, Roger Crouch or George Hargett in left field and Robert McAdams in right field all

played regularly as first-year men.

The sophomore pitchers included Chuck McGuire, who was an all-conference choice with a 5-2 win-loss record; Johnnie Crain (3-0) and Richard Beller (4-2).

Only three performers, none of them regulars, are expected to be lost for next season. They are utility infielders John Burton and John Hudson, and pitcher Bob Collins.

Only three seniors will be lost to Thomas' squad next season — Thad Crooks, weight man Charles Tiemann and javelin thrower John Long.

4 Aggs Make All-SWC Team

Four Aggies have been named as members of the 13-man All-Southwest Conference baseball team. Shortstop David Johnson was among the five choices who were a unanimous vote.

The others receiving votes from all the coaches were Texas' pitcher Tom Belcher, his teammates second baseman Pat Rigby and left fielder Chuck Knutson, and Baylor's soph pitching ace, Frank Charton.

Longhorn catcher Gary London won the spot, behind the plate, while Aggie catcher Bill Puckett gained votes as the second choice

in that position.

Farmer hurler Chuck McGuire joined Belcher and Charton as one of the All-SWC pitchers.

Ag first baseman Frank Stark was the conference pick in his position.

Bill Hancock won the honors at third and, along with Johnson and Stark, the infield was all Aggie save for unopposed Rigby.

Ed Kasper of Texas was named for third base and utility infielder and was picked for the utility spot. The outfield picks were Knutson in left, Bob Bigley of TCU in center and Rice's Jim Fox at right. Baylor's Tommy Letbetter got votes for each outfield slot and the utility position, as he won the latter.

The Ph.D. hoods will not be worn in the procession since all such candidates will be hooded on the stage as a part of the ceremonies. Candidates for the degree of Doctor of Veterinary Medicine will wear the doctor's cap, gown and hood appropriate to this degree.
 Candidates for the Master's Degree will wear the Master's cap and gown. All civilian students who are candidates for the Bachelor's Degree will wear the bachelor's cap and gown. Six A&M athletic teams will be honored at the annual spring sports barbecue at The Grove Thursday at 6 p.m.

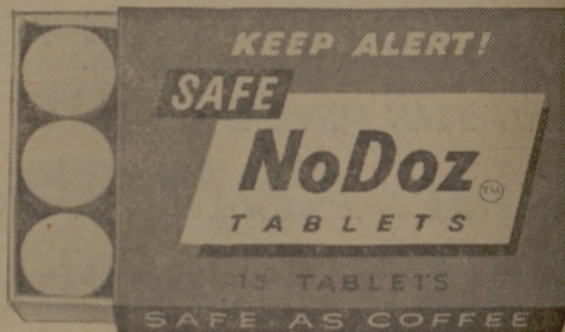
Sponsoring the stag affair are the Brazos County A&M Club and the A&M Athletic Department.

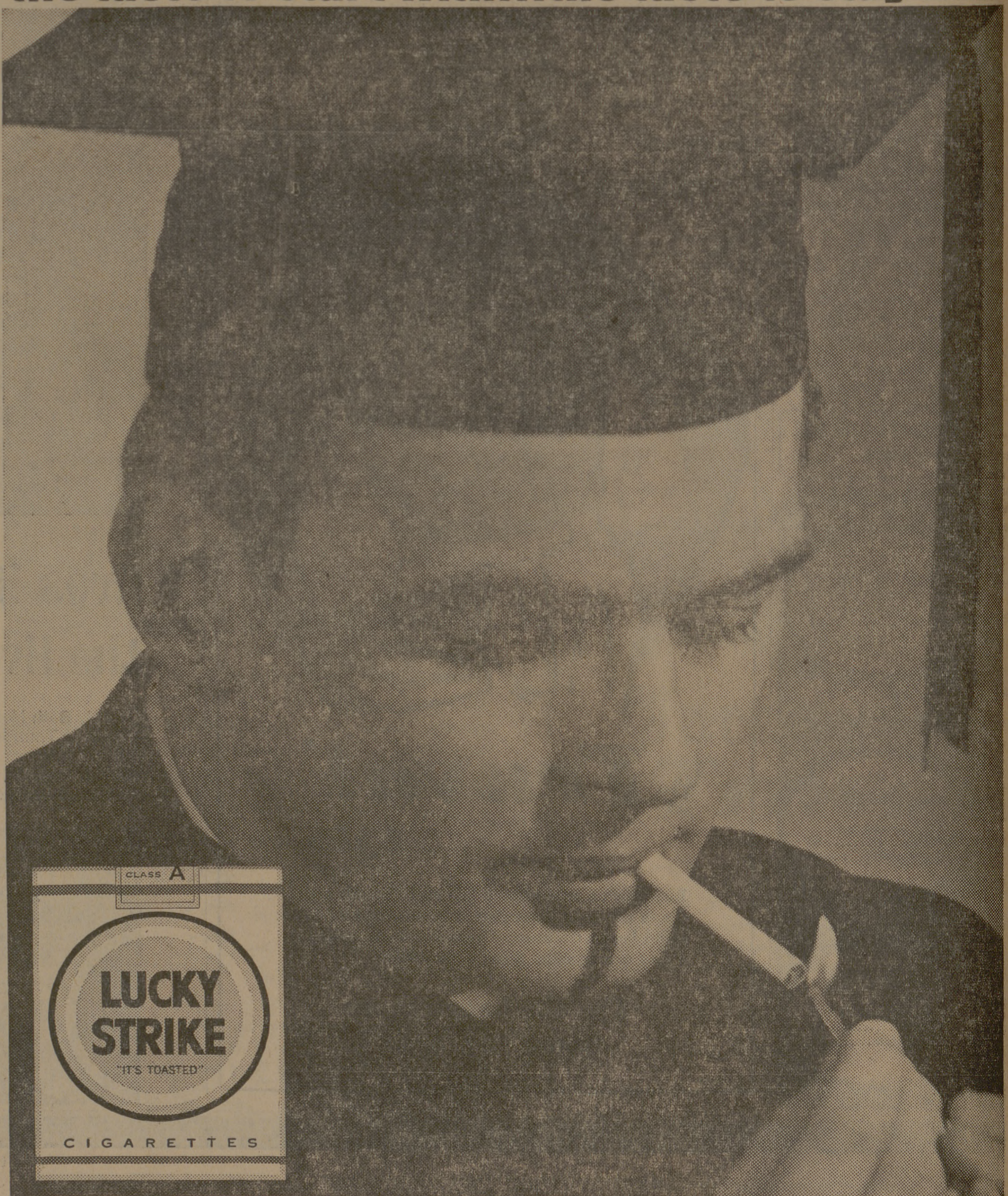
