structive long-range development of the state.

Dr. Suttle's professional organizations include the American Chemical Society, the American Nuclear Society, the American Physical Society, and the Institute of Radio Engineers. He is also a charter member of the Atomic Industrial Forum.

Honor societies of which Dr. Suttle is a member include Phi Eta Sigma, Sigma Xi, and Phi Kappa Phi. He is also an "Honoris Clausa" member of the Mississippi State University chapter of Omicron Delta Kappa.

Since his appointment as the director of the Mississippi Industrial and Technological Research Commission, Dr. Suttle has filled over one-hundred speaking engagements within and without the State. Dr. Suttle's most recent honor came during the past year when he was named as one of the fifteen "Outstanding Young Leaders in the South."

Even Humans Use Heating Principle

FREEMONT, Texas (AP) — When protected from the wind and enjoying the warmth of sunshine you may not have realized — and probably could have cared less — that you were using a special principle of heating.

That principle is heating by infrared rays. It has been used in Dow Chemical Co.'s Texas Division. The infrared rays heat only objects they strike.

A good feature is that the air within a building does not have to be heated in order for workers to be comfortable.

The infrared heating units are placed so that their rays overlap. They easily reach all working places in the 75 by 200-foot boiler shop annex where they are installed here.

Infrared rays are waves of energy produced, for instance, by the sun, a bonfire or by some heated object.

The rays travel in straight lines at 186,000 miles per second and do not warm the air through which they pass — only the bodies which absorb them. They can be reflected or focused.

In the trial project at the shop annex there are 26 infrared units. They burn natural gas which is fed through a ceramic plate, perforated with 200 holes per square inch, creating a temperature of 1,600 degrees F. This heat is then sent out as electromagnetic energy by chrome-plated reflectors.

The maintenance cost on the infrared units is slight and they produce no draft or noise.

Summer Room Reservations To Be Available July 9

All students, including those living in college apartments, who do

not plan to line in dormitories during the second term must secure or renew their day student permits at the housing office before paying fees. Such students are urged to do this before registration day on July 11, in order to save time for all concerned.
