Twenty-five students who pursued premedical or pre dental studies at A&M have been accepted for 1962-63 classes at eight medical and dental colleges plus a school of osteopathy. Three of the students won scholarships ranging upward to \$1,500 in value.

The listing by the Premedical and Pre dental Committee shows

most of the students plan to study at professional schools and colleges in Texas. Others will attend professional schools of Yale University, Duke University, the University of Tennessee and the School of Osteopathy at Kirksville, Mo.

The committee also reported William F. Pederson of Lufkin won a \$1,500 scholarship for the first year of studies at the Southwestern Medical School of the University of Texas at Dallas. Houston Endowment, Inc., made the award.

Pederson also received a tuition scholarship from the school and will serve as a laboratory assistant in anatomy. At A&M he was an undergraduate assistant in the Department of Biology, held a Julia Ball Lee scholarship and was active in campus life.

E. M. (Ted) Trew, extension pasture specialist, has been assigned leadership responsibility coordinating an intensive study of East Texas problems and resources directed toward development of an action program to increase net income of the area, Dr. R. E. Patterson, Dean of Agriculture, announced today.

Trew will discuss problems and possible solutions with agricultural and business leaders throughout East Texas, tabulate research data of particular significance to the area, and present the findings to a broadly representative group of citizens, including heads of state and federal agencies, who will chart the overall course of action.

Dr. Everett R. Glazener, a faculty member of the Department of Industrial Education, is author of a textbook "Basic Metalwork." This text is published by the Steck Publishing Company, Austin.

The book has been prepared for use by students taking industrial arts metalwork for the first time in the junior or senior high schools. It includes introductory and process experiences in sheet metal, ornamental iron, art metal, welding, foundry and machine shops.
