Architecture Prof Presents Paper During World Meeting

James H. Marsh, assistant professor of architecture, will present a paper at the World Conference on Shell Structures in San Francisco, Calif., Oct. 1-4. Titled "Construction of Thin Shell Structures by the Lift-Shape Process," the paper will describe design and construction of the

thin-shell shelter built by the Texas Engineering Experiment Station's architectural research group at Hensel Park.

Marsh, who is also an assistant research architect with the TEES, designed and supervised the construction of the Hensel Park structure, the largest of its type built to date.

Some 95 engineers architects and builders from 19 nations will present papers at the conference. Also attending from A&M will be Ben Evans, co-ordinator for the TEES architectural research group.

Marsh's paper discusses the construction of thin shell structures that eliminate necessity of conventional form work. His project included laying out a reinforced pattern in a projected plan. By lifting and warping the reinforced pattern, a reinforced skeletal structure is developed upon which a covering material may be applied.

planned in an architectural style described as not severely modern and will use brick and stone to harmonize with the existing buildings. Additional details will be released following a directors meeting in November.

The concept of providing the greatest possible amount of open space for bookstacks and for individual seating of students so as to bring the book and reader together is the key to the proposed interior arrangement. The plan provides a minimum of fixed walls.

Opening of the library stacks to undergraduates is a major trend in present college and university library construction, Houze said.

Rhodes Competition Opens

Any A&M student desiring to apply for a Rhodes Scholarship must do so before Oct. 10, it was announced Wednesday. Dr. R. H. Ballinger of the Department of English is the college representative for the scholarships.

A long and involved selection procedure as well as stringent personal and academic qualifications must be met by applicants. A student here also must be recommended by President Earl Rudder to state selection committee.

This committee, which will meet Dec. 12, will nominate two candi-

dates to the district selection committee.

Four winners will be chosen from this district, which also includes Alabama, Mississippi, Louisiana, Oklahoma and Arkansas.

Personal qualifications are that a student be a male, unmarried and between 18 and 24. At least junior standing in some degree-granting university is required.

No restriction is placed upon a Rhodes scholar's choice of study. All studies are taken at the University of Oxford in England.

Subjects which can be exclusive-

ly studied include literae human-

iores, mathematics, physics, chemistry, animal physiology, zoology, biochemistry, botany, geology, engineering science, science of metals, geography, agriculture, jurisprudence, modern history, theology, oriental subjects, English language and literature, philosophy-politics-economics, psychology-philosophy-physiology, modern languages forestry and music.

According to the scholarship brochure "quality of both character and intellect is the most important requirements for a Rhodes scholarship."

There have been only two previous A&M Rhodes scholars. Charles W. Thomas, '22, is now head of the Department of Engineering at New York State Teachers College, and Jack E. Brooks, '47, is now on the technical staff of Ramo-Woolridge Corp.

Tom Woodeshick, West Virginia right halfback, is a cousin of former American League pitcher Hal Woodeshick who is now pitching for the Houston Colts in the National League.
