

# Peach, Plum Growers Meet

The 10th annual Texas Peach and Plum Growers Conference and Short Course will be held Tuesday and Wednesday in the Memorial Student Center.

Sponsored by the college and growers, the conference will feature subjects ranging from insect and disease control to roadside marketing of fruit.

Blueford Hancock, Texas Agricultural Extension Service horticulturist, said program activities will start at 10 a.m. the first day and end at noon the second day.

He said the meetings the open to all fruit growers and members of related industries.

Subjects and speakers are "Peach Promotional Activities in Louisiana" by Donald Spurlock, extension horticulturist at Louisiana State University; "New Methods of Controlling Peach Tree Borers and Time of Applying Insecticides," Dr. Don King, A&M Department of Entomology; "Problems and Possibilities in New Texas Plum Varieties," Harry Morris, Agricultural Experiment Station, Tyler.

Others are "Effect of Time of Application and Source of Nitrogen on Elberta Peach Trees," Dr. Roy C. Rom, University of Arkansas Department of Horticulture; "A Peach Breeding Program for the South," Lynn Hawthorne, LSU Department of Horticulture; "Federal Crop Insurance for Peaches," J. F. Rosborough, peach grower at Marshall; "New Fruit Packing Equipment," John Taylor, North Louisiana Agricultural Experiment Station.

Also, "An Insect Control Program for Texas Fruit Orchards," C. F. Garner, A&M extension entomologist; "History of Peach and Plum Growing in Texas," Fred Brison, A&M horticulture section; "Marketing Texas Peaches Through Roadside Stands," Tom Denman, West Cross Timbers Experiment Station, Stephenville; "Thinning Peach Fruit by Use of Chemicals," George Madden and Dr. Benton Storey, A&M horticulture section.

Others are "Methods of Combating Nematodes on Fruit Trees," Jerrel Johnson and Storey; "Report on Peach Jamboree in Gillespie County," Simon Burg; "Report on Parker County Fruit Growers Association Activities," County Agent Gene Sears; and "Report on Camp-Upshur Counties Peach Growers Association," County Agent Robert B. Walsh.

## Church's Role Will Highlight Meeting

The role of the church in our modern society will be discussed by outstanding educators, laymen and clergymen during the 17th annual Town and Country Church Conference. It will be held October 17-19 in the MSC, explains Dr. Bardin H. Nelson, program coordinator and professor in the Department of Agricultural Economics and Sociology.

Under this year's conference theme, "The Dignity of Man in Town and Country Living," emphasis will be placed on youth development and dignity and purposeful family living, Nelson said. Workshop sessions will consider problems of the community and the influence of church activities in youth development and family life stability, he added.

# Conference Speaker Views Space Center's Huge Impact

Economic impact of NASA's Manned Spacecraft Center in the Houston area was described in terms of \$120 million here Thursday.

Continuing expenditures will have an equal or greater indirect impact on industrial growth throughout Texas and the Southwest, Paul E. Purser of NASA told more than 250 businessmen attending the 12th annual Texas Industrial Development Conference.

Opening the two-day session was Dr. A. D. Suttle, vice-president for research, who told conference participants that industrial development in Texas must move in tune with the times or it will be in trouble.

He pointed out that approximately 42 per cent of the total federal expenditure (\$12.3 billion) for research and development in the space sciences, is going to California. If this percentage were expended in Texas the total economic impact would exceed the current total income of state, he said.

Purser said the Manned Spacecraft Center will by July, 1963, provide approximately 3,000 new jobs in Houston with a payroll of about \$20 million a year. The new center is also attracting many industrial firms to the state.

"Since we became established in Houston at the first of this year, 75 industrial firms have opened offices in the Houston area to work with NASA," he said.

The new center also has an impact on schools — from kindergarten through college, he noted. To better prepare its employees for the difficult scientific and engineering tasks ahead, NASA sponsors a graduate training program for its technical personnel.
