

Professor Notes Rising Interest In G. B. Shaw

George Bernard Shaw, the man of many talents and long years on the London scene, is destined to occupy one of the more prominent places in Twentieth Century literature, according to Dr. E. E. Stokes Jr., associate professor of English, who has contributed arti-

cles about Shaw to several publications.

Shaw's fame took a natural dip following his death in 1950 but indications that his posthumous fame are rising have been noted by Stokes.

"I believe," Stokes said, "a respectable nucleus of his works will survive, but that Shaw will have an even more important place in his role as a thinker."

Shaw gained fame as a music and drama critic before he became a playwright and social thinker, a thinker more noted for synthesizing the thoughts of others than for originality.


