THE BATTALION Houston Press Newspaperman Speaks Here

"There is no hope for the satisfied man," John C. (Jack) Mohler, city editor of the Houston Press, told the 90 delegates to the Texas Junior College Press Association at a banquet Monday night.

"We are becoming at nation of satisfied men and there is no hope for the satisfied man . . . the rugged individualist is dying fast. The newspaper has changed and the role of the editor has changed too," Mohler began.

Mohler, a veteran of 23 years of newspaper experience and winner of numerous awards as a writer, spoke on journalism as a career, warning the delegates that there would be years of hard work for little money, frustration and dis-

"There will be days," Mohler said, "when you'll think every nut this side of Waxahachie has singled you out . . . you will rack your brain for a better way to say this man lived, died or was injured."

But the rewards, he pointed out, are gaining an insight into life, developing a compassion for fellow mortals and "a lot of laughs." What will be the pay? It depends on the individual. Of the hundreds of newspapermen he's known, Mohler says that he can't think of a half a dozen he didn't






