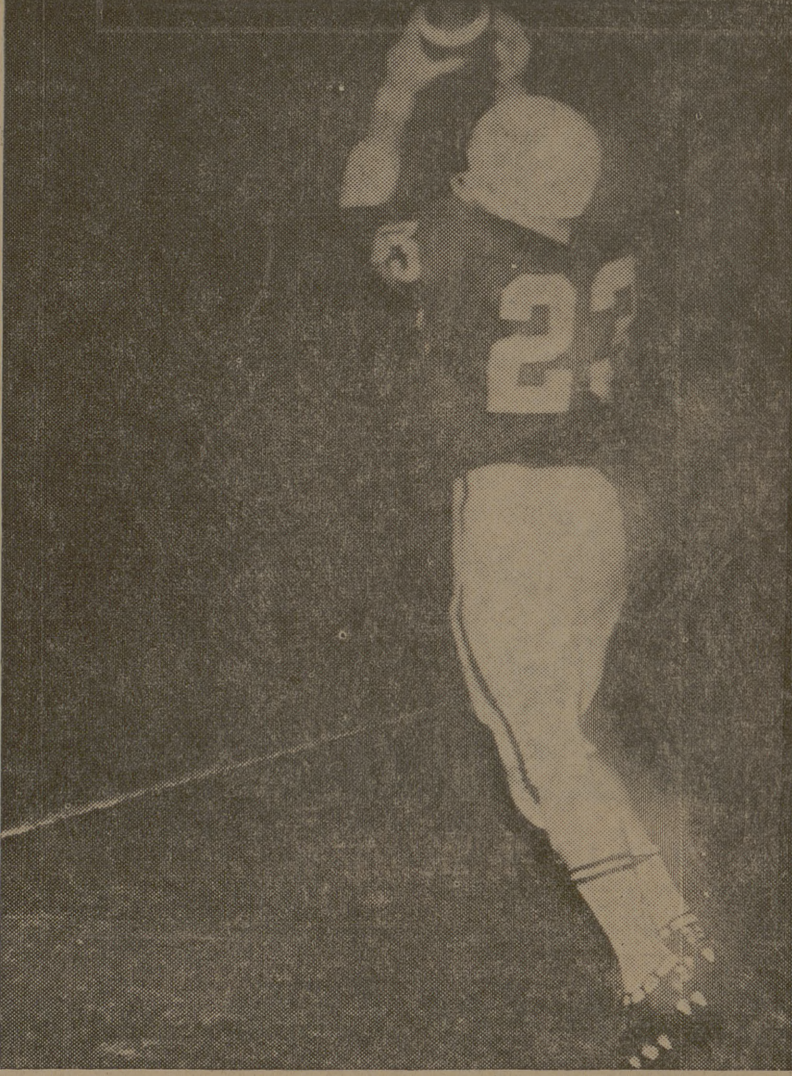

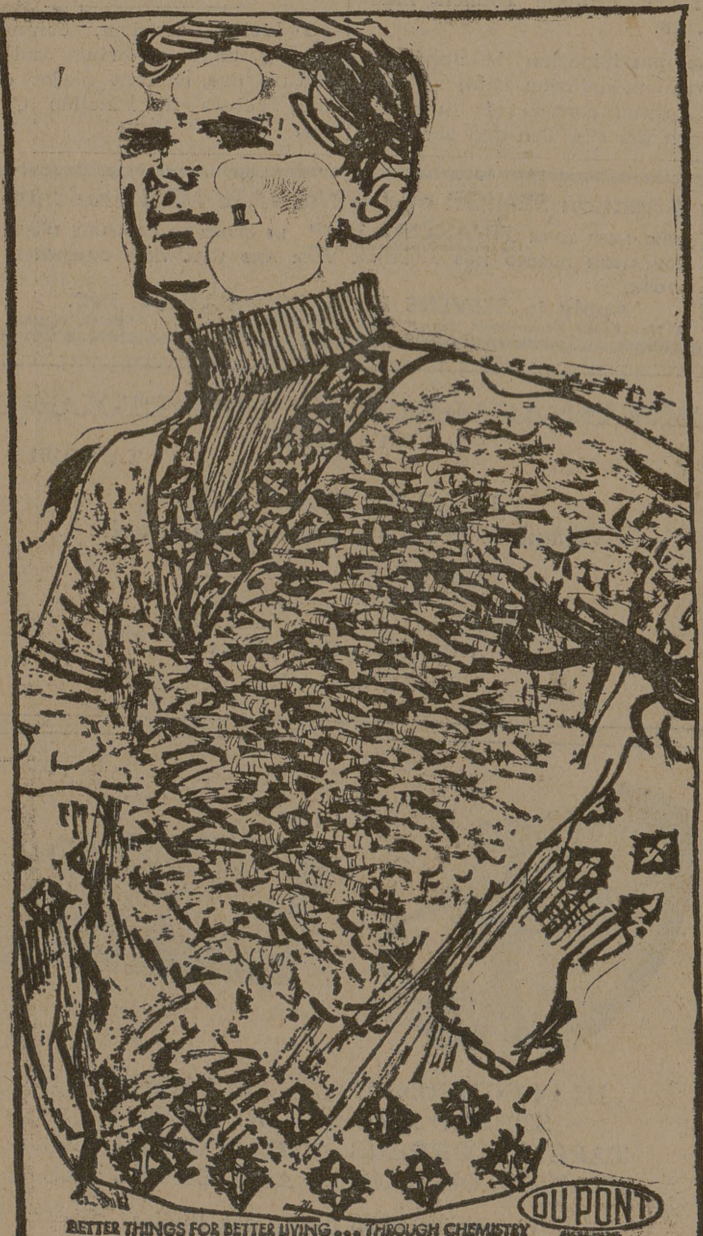


George Hargett Snags Pass

PHILADELPHIA (AP)—Heavyweight champion Sonny Liston refused Tuesday to appear before a New York state legislative committee investigating professional boxing.
Liston, through a telegram signed by his attorney, Morton Witkin, denied previous testimony by another heavyweight boxer, Cortez Stewart, that Frank (Blinky) Palermo asked Stewart to be a sparring partner for the champ before his one-round kayo of Floyd Patterson Sept. 25 in Chicago.
Palermo last year was described by a U.S. Senate committee as a member of an underworld syndicate that controlled Liston's boxing destiny.

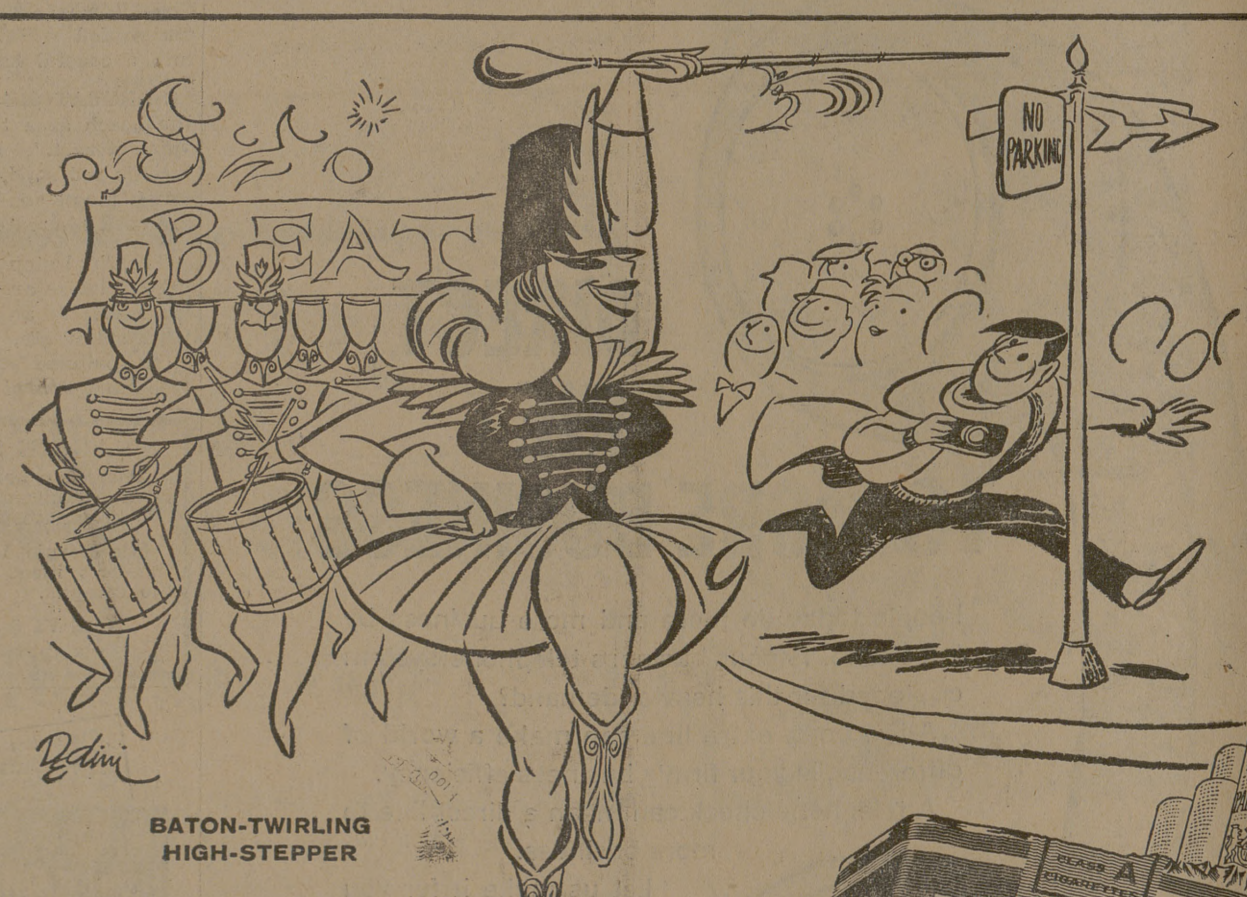
